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Explanation of Enrollment Data:

- 1. The Spring Final 2011 date is June 10, 2011. Data included in this report is information captured from the Banner System Tables.
- 2. Percent Difference (also % difference) in this report is the measure of change from Spring Final 2010 to Spring 2011 as a percentage. Caution: When considering % change it is important to note that increases or decreases in categories with low numbers will result in a high percentage change.
- 3. Credit hour figures are net earned figures. Students who dropped from all courses are not included in the headcount and credit hours count. Students who withdrew are counted.
- 4. Due to rounding, some graphs may not equal 100%.
- 5. Funding Summary:
 - a. Headcount: Students counted in cash have only cash funded courses
 - b. Credit Hours: On-Campus and Cash credit hours are determined by the accounting code assigned to the course .
- 6. Undergraduate definition of Part time and Full time students:
 - a. Part-time: students enrolled for less than 12 credit hours
 - b. Full-time: students enrolled for 12 credit hours or more.
- 7. Graduate definition of Part time and Full time students:
 - a. Part-time: students enrolled for less than 9 credit hours
 - b. Full-time: students enrolled for 9 or more credit hours
- 8. Race/Ethnicity Categories are new and adhere to the new reporting standards as mandated by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB). http://www.whitehouse.gov/omb/fedreg_notice_15
- 9. Spring 2010 race and ethnicity figures are provided but should not be used as a direct comparison.
- 10. Starting in 2011 students enrolled in the Colorado School of Public Health (MPH in Community Health Education and the Certificate in Public Health Sciences) are no longer included in the final enrollment report. Spring 2010 comparison numbers have been adjusted to also exclude CSPH students.
- 11. First generation is defined as a student who reported that neither parent/guardian graduated from a four-year college. Students that did not report are classified as non-first generation.
- 12. Low income student is a student who is Pell Grant eligible. Statistics in this report reflect those students who were offered a Pell Grant greater than zero.
- 13. The Graduate Unclassified Classification are students who are attending but have not yet been accepted into a Masters or Doctorate program or are non-degree seeking students.
- 14. Starting in 2011 WICHE students are included in the Resident category. Spring 2010 classification of WICHE students have been adjusted to match the 2011 method.
- 15. Funding Summary:
 - a. Headcount: Students counted in cash have only cash funded courses
 - b. Credit Hours Use accounting codes on the course to count credit hours as cash or on campus
- 16. Non-Degree seeking undergraduate student are included in University College enrollment and Non-Degree seeking graduate students are included in the Graduate School enrollment.
- 17. Extended Studies summary includes any student that took a cash funded course. The credit hours are calculated on only cash courses and use the accounting codes to determine Extended Studies or Main Campus.

Executive Summary

Headcount by Classification (Page 6)

The total university Spring Final headcount of 11,847 is up by 171 students which is a 1.5% increase from Spring Final 2010. Undergraduate had a 1.8% increase from Spring Final 2010 while graduate student headcount rose by 0.1%. Undergraduate sophomores increased 11.5% (222 students) from Spring Final 2010. Senior classification is 31% of the undergraduate population. Graduate doctoral headcount increased by 53 students or 11.7% while unclassified grad students decreased by just about the same number of students. The number of graduate masters students remained fairly constant with a 0.9% or 12 student increase. 58 percent of graduate students are pursuing a Masters degree.

Credit Hours by Classification (Page 7)

The student credit hour grand total is 143,422, a 1.3% increase from Spring Final 2010. 89% of Undergraduate credit hours are resident and 81% of Graduate credit hours are resident. Undergraduate headcount (see Table Headcount by Classification) has increased by 1.8% generating a 0.9% increase in credit hours. Even though the graduate headcount went up slightly (0.9%) the total credit hours increased by 5% from Spring Final 2010.

Funding Summary Headcount (Page 8)

Undergraduate headcount for students with only cash funded courses rose by 26% (101) over last year. Graduate cash funded headcount decreased from 865 to 667 (-22.9%). Overall students with only cash courses decreased 7.7% and now make up 9.8 % of the student population.

Funding Summary Credit Hours (Page 9)

Cash course credit hours increased 48.5% over Spring Final 2010 with undergraduate increasing by 19.3% and graduate increasing by 78.2%. In 2011 cash credit hours were 6.4% of all credit hours which is up from 4.3% in Spring 2011.

Course Load Summary (Page 10)

The undergraduate full-time and part-time breakdown has changed only slightly from Spring Final 2010 while the percentage of graduates that are full time has increased from 38% to 40%.

Undergraduate Enrollment by Ethnicity (Page 11)

Spring Final 2011 to Spring Final 2010 ethnicity and race comparisons cannot be made with accuracy due to the transition to the new race/ethnicity data collection standards. Approximately 19% of the undergraduate population is minority of which, 2.2% identified more than one race/ethnicity (multi-racial), a category that is new under the new reporting method. Within the minority category, the Hispanic classification is the largest at 57%, and represents 11% of the entire undergraduate population. Hawaiian Only and Native American Only, minority groups account for less than 1% of the total undergraduate population. The minority classification can be compared to Spring Final 2010 and indicates a 1.3% increase in undergraduate minorities. It is unknown whether the multi-race category contributed to this increase.

Graduate Enrollment by Ethnicity (Page 12)

Spring Final 2011 to Spring Final 2010 ethnicity and race comparisons cannot be made with accuracy due to the transition to the new race/ethnicity data collection standards. The graduate population remained relatively constant between minorities and non-minorities. Forty (40) students identified with the new classification, multi-racial. Hispanics are 40% of the minority category and represent 5% of the total graduate population.

Undergraduate First Generation & Undergraduate Low Income (Page 14)

Low income is defined as students who have been offered a Pell Grant and 31% of the undergraduate population is considered low income.

Undergraduate First Generation and Low Income (Page 15)

Approximately 58% of the undergraduate students are classified as neither first generation nor low income. First generation and low income classified are 11% of the total undergraduate population.

New Student Enrollment (Page 16)

321 new transfer undergraduate students started in the spring of 2011 compared to 301 in 2010. Graduate New Students enrollment is down nearly 15.2% (12 students.

Students Enrolled in (at least one) Online Course (Page 17)

The percent of undergraduates enrolling in a least one on-line course fairly constant while graduate students enrolling in online courses decreased from 41% to 32%.

Students enrolled by Gender (Page 18)

Females make up 62% of the undergraduate population which is up slightly from 2010. The percentage of graduate males (27%) to females (73%) did not change from 2010.

College Headcount (Page 21)


Generally, the distribution of enrollment among the colleges remains stable. The College of Natural & Health Sciences headcount is 29% of the undergraduate total headcount of 9,502. College of Education & Behavioral Sciences headcount increased 13% from spring 2010. The College of Performing & Visual Arts saw a decrease in undergraduate headcount 26 students or 3% however the PVA graduate headcount increased 24 students or 18%.


Extended Studies Summary (Page 22)

Extended Studies enrollment includes students who took at least one cash course. No comparative Spring Final 2010 information is provided. Extended Studies headcount encompasses 13% of the total student population and 8% of the total credit hours. Of the 1,514 graduate (761) and undergraduate (398) students taking Extended Studies courses, 77% of them are degree-seeking.
