Column A	Name of the college or university
Column B	Code used to identify the institution
Column C	Course prefix <ul style="list-style-type: none">Some schools do not use a prefix and numbering system; NCS indicates that we used a generic prefix.
Column D	Course number <ul style="list-style-type: none">Some schools do not use a prefix and numbering system; NCS numbering system indicates that we used a generic course number.
Column E	Name of the course
Column F	UNC prefix <ul style="list-style-type: none">Identifies the corresponding UNC academic unit
Column G	UNC course number <ul style="list-style-type: none">A single "X" indicates university-wide elective credit.A double "XX" indicates the course has been reviewed by departmental faculty as departmental elective credit.Courses evaluated as university-wide or departmental elective credit may be substituted for degree requirements at the discretion of the major or minor advisor.
Column H	Number of U.S. credits that will be awarded <ul style="list-style-type: none">If this column is blank, the credit value may not yet be determined.Credit values are verified when the official transcript is received.
Column I	Name of the UNC course
Column J	Attributes associated with the course <ul style="list-style-type: none">"ISE" = study abroad course"TREV" = course reviewed by departmental faculty"LC" + a number indicates which area of the Liberal Arts Core will be satisfied (e.g. LC4, LC7, etc.)"LA" + a number indicates which area of the Liberal Arts Curriculum will be satisfied (i.e. LAA1, LAH4, LAIS, etc.)Other departmental attributes may exist (e.g. FLNG, HSEU, etc.)
Column K	The nation where the school is located <ul style="list-style-type: none">If you have selected 'United States' as the nation, you will see the schools who issue the transcripts for a study abroad experience. For example, if you decide upon a Semester at Sea experience, the transcript is issued by Colorado State University.
