Section I: Degree/Program Requirements

A. Institutional graduation requirements for this degree program.

The graduation requirement for a transfer student pursuing Art: ART K-12 will be no different than the graduation requirements for a native student, including the minimum number of semester hours required for graduation requirements. Specifically, the student must complete the following requirements:

- Complete at least 134 credit hours, and
- Successfully complete the required 48 hours in the major and
- To graduate with a B.A. in Art & Design, all students must receive a 3.0 GPA or higher in all courses in the major and a 2.8 GPA or higher for overall university coursework.
- Complete the Admission Process and Portfolio Review: Students planning to major in Art & Design must submit an application and an entry portfolio, consisting of artwork and essay. Application form and instructions are available in the School of Art & Design office, or on their webpage, www.arts.unco.edu.visarts and
- Complete the Freshman Foundation requirements before they can begin their advanced art studies. The Freshman Foundation Courses include Art 181, 182, 183, 184, & 234 which must be completed with a 3.0 GPA and
- Successfully complete the Foundation Portfolio with a minimum score of 3 on a 4 point scale and
- It is important to note that the Art & Design major cannot be completed within 2 years. The first year is spent in completing the Freshman Foundation courses and requirements. Transfer students considering applying to the Art & Design program are advised that it is not possible to complete requirements in fewer than four regular semesters and
- Complete a Senior Portfolio: An exit level Senior Portfolio assessment is required prior to graduation. The portfolio consists of work from the student's concentration area. Students are evaluated on their knowledge and successful demonstration of: professional portfolio preparation of art work, art history and cultures, and verbal and written critical analysis.

- PTEP K-12 Teaching Emphasis: PTEP requirements follow at bottom of chart.
- Complete and receive at least a grade of B or above in ENG 122 or 123 (CC; Eng 121 or 122).
- Students will make formal application and complete admission requirements while enrolled in EDFE 270 and a minimum GPA of 2.50 is required prior to enrollment.
- First semester transfer students may enroll their first semester on campus and the GPA will be evaluated at the end of the semester.
- At the time application is made to PTEP, the student must also apply for the Art Education/PTEP.
- It is recommended that application for PTEP be made during the sophomore year, or after completing 30 semester hours of University coursework and no later than the first semester of the junior year. Application to PTEP must be made at the beginning of the semester
- In addition to fulfilling program procedures and course requirements, an art education student must have and maintain a minimum grade point average of 3.0 in Art and a 2.80 GPA for overall University coursework.

- Student Teaching: Before receiving approval to student teach, an art education student must complete the Art Education PTEP review.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- A. Grade Eligibility.
Only academic courses with a letter grade of C or better are transferable. The four-year institution will accept and count toward meeting graduation requirements all state guaranteed general education courses that have a grade of C or better.
- B. UNC accepts some scores of 3 and accepts scores of 4 and above on Advanced Placement tests and scores of 4 and above earned on International Baccalaureate tests.

- C. UNC will accept all approved credits earned with ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier may be evaluated on an individual basis.
- D. UNC may apply state guaranteed general education (gtP) courses toward the major or other graduation requirements if that facilitates the student's graduation more effectively.

Section III: Appeal Process

- A. Institutional Appeal Process
Students who follow this agreement shall have the right to appeal a transfer decision that appears to be inconsistent with the terms and courses listed in this agreement. Appeals pertaining to this 2008-2009 Transfer Guide should be filed with the institution.
