Section I: Degree/Program Requirements

A. Institutional graduation requirements for this degree program.

The graduation requirement for a transfer student pursuing Music: Jazz Studies will be no different than the graduation requirements for a native student, including the minimum number of semester hours required for graduation requirements. Specifically, the student must complete the following requirements:

- Complete at least 120 credit hours and
- Successfully complete the required 78-79 credit hours in the major and
- Successfully complete 18 credit hours in the required minor and
- Submit an application and complete successfully complete an audition to the School of Music and
- MUS 100 Recitals, Concerts and Productions must be taken each semester in residence and
- Individual Performance and Major Musical Organizations during each semester in residence must be completed and
- Students must take Individual Performance in Jazz each semester in residence, Individual performance each of the first four semesters in residence and continue to enroll in Individual Performance (200 level) each semester until proficiency sufficient to enter 400 level Individual Performance courses are demonstrated.
- Participate in Jazz Ensembles each semester in residence and Major Musical Organizations a minimum of 4 semesters in residency
- Earn at least a 2.00 GPA in courses completed at UNC.

B. Required courses in Major, including pre-requisites and required Support courses in the chart below.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE REQUIRED COURSES: Required courses to be taken as part of AA/AS degree to guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate degree in 60 additional credits after transfer. They are as follow: Applied-music audition is required for admission to all School of Music undergraduate degree programs. Students must also demonstrate appropriate knowledge of music history and theory for admission to this program.

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- A. Grade Eligibility.
Only academic courses with a letter grade of C or better are transferable. The four-year institution will accept and count toward meeting graduation requirements all state guaranteed general education courses that have a grade of C or better.
- B. UNC accepts some scores of 3 and accepts scores of 4 and above on Advanced Placement tests and scores of 4 and above earned on International Baccalaureate tests.

- C. UNC will accept all approved credits earned with ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier may be evaluated on an individual basis.
- D. UNC may apply state guaranteed general education (gtP) courses toward the major or other graduation requirements if that facilitates the student's graduation more effectively.

Section III: Appeal Process

- A. Institutional Appeal Process
Students who follow this agreement shall have the right to appeal a transfer decision that appears to be inconsistent with the terms and courses listed in this agreement. Appeals pertaining to this 2008-2009 Transfer Guide should be filed with the institution. A student
