Section I: Degree/Program Requirements

- A. Institutional graduation requirements for this degree program. The graduation requirement for a transfer student pursuing Music Education: Instrumental Music K-12 Teaching will be no different than the graduation requirements for a native student, including the minimum number of semester hours required for graduation requirements. Specifically, the student must meet the following requirements.
- Complete at least 126 credit hours, and
 - Successfully complete the required 55 credit hours in the major and
 - Earn at least a 2.00 GPA in courses completed at UNC
 - Complete 40 hours of Required PTEP credits
 - Submit an application and complete successfully complete an audition to the School of Music and
 - MUS 100 Recitals, Concerts and Productions must be taken each semester in residence and
 - Individual Performance and Major Musical Organizations during each semester in residence must be completed and
 - Earn at least a 2.00 GPA in courses completed at UNC.

K-12 PTEP

- PTEP requirements follow at bottom of chart.
- Complete and receive at least a grade of B or above in ENG 122 or 123 (CC; Eng 121 or 122) and
- Complete COMM 100, 103 (CC Com 115) and
- make formal application and complete admission requirements while enrolled in EDFE 270
- A minimum GPA of 2.50 is required prior to enrollment.
- First semester transfer students may enroll their first semester on campus and the GPA will be evaluated at the end of the semester.
- Students must enroll in, and satisfactorily complete, these courses each semester: Individual Performance (lessons), a major musical ensemble, and MUS 100-Recitals, concerts and Productions.
- Demonstrate professional promise as a teacher to the satisfaction of the music education faculty, including an interview with the faculty at the conclusion of MUS 210 Introduction to Music Education
- Meet all music performance and recital attendance requirements listed in the respective departmental handbooks

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- A. Grade Eligibility.
Only academic courses with a letter grade of C or better are transferable. The four-year institution will accept and count toward meeting graduation requirements all state guaranteed general education courses that have a grade of C or better.
- B. UNC accepts some scores of 3 and accepts scores of 4 and above on Advanced Placement tests and scores of 4 and above earned on International Baccalaureate tests.

- C. UNC will accept all approved credits earned with ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier may be evaluated on an individual basis.
- D. UNC may apply state guaranteed general education (gtP) courses toward the major or other graduation requirements if that facilitates the student's graduation more effectively.

Section III: Appeal Process

- A. Institutional Appeal Process
Students who follow this agreement shall have the right to appeal a transfer decision that appears to be inconsistent with the terms and courses listed in this agreement. Appeals pertaining to this 2008-2009 Transfer Guide should be filed with the institution.
