

**2008-2009 TRANSFER GUIDE
ATHLETIC TRAINING
UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN COLORADO**

Section I: Degree/Program Requirements

- A. Institutional graduation requirements for this degree program. The graduation requirement for a transfer student pursuing Athletic Training will be no different than the graduation requirements for a native student, including the minimum number of semester hours required for graduation requirements. There are higher GPA requirements for admission into the clinical athletic training program and an application is required.
- The designation of Athletic Training as a major does not assure admission to the Clinical Athletic Training Program and
 - Applications are only accepted during fall semester and
 - Prior to application, students must complete the prerequisite courses: BIO 110; BIO 245, CHEM 281, SES 181, SES 220, SES 233, and SES 380 and
 - Students must possess a minimum GPA of 2.8 and
 - Admission is based on available openings, GPA grades in the prerequisite courses, prerequisite exam and an interview

Specifically, the student must meet the following requirements.

- Complete at least 120 credit hours, and
- Successfully complete the required 62 credit hours in the major, and
- Earn at least a grade of 'C' or higher (C-) is unacceptable in all SES courses and
- Earn at least a 2.00 GPA in courses completed at UNC.

- B. Required courses in Major, including pre-requisites and required Support courses in the chart below.

COMMUNITY COLLEGE REQUIRED COURSES: Required courses to be taken as part of AA degree to guarantee the completion of a baccalaureate degree in 60 additional credits after transfer. They are as follows:

Prior to application, students must complete the prerequisite courses: BIO 110; BIO 245, CHEM 281, SES 181, SES 220, SES 233, and SES 380

Section II: Transfer of Credit

- A. Grade Eligibility.
Only academic courses with a letter grade of C or better are transferable. The four-year institution will accept and count toward meeting graduation requirements all state guaranteed general education courses that have a grade of C or better.
- B. UNC accepts some scores of 3 and accepts scores of 4 and above on Advanced Placement tests and scores of 4 and above earned on International Baccalaureate tests.

- C. UNC will accept all approved credits earned with ten years of transfer. Courses earned more than ten years earlier may be evaluated on an individual basis.
- D. UNC may apply state guaranteed general education (gtP) courses toward the major or other graduation requirements if that facilitates the student's graduation more effectively.

Section III: Appeal Process

A. Institutional Appeal Process

Students who follow this agreement shall have the right to appeal a transfer decision that appears to be inconsistent with the terms and courses listed in this agreement. Appeals pertaining to this 2008-2009 Transfer Guide should be filed with the institution.
