ANNUAL FUND

The Telephone Outreach Program (TOP) achieved great success with the Fall 2006 phone campaign. During the campaign CEBS alumni pledged \$14,775, of that \$9,675 was designated to CEBS programs. So far this year the TOP is only \$2,390.00 from surpassing the amount of pledged dollars designated to the College of Education and Behavioral Sciences in Fiscal Year 2006 (July 1, 2005 to December 13, 2005) and there is still another semester of calling yet to go. The TOP has seen a significant increase in dollars pledged since 2004-2005. The total dollars pledged by CEBS alumni has increased from \$8,310 to \$14,775. Almost double! Congratulations to our student callers and the Annual Fund.

Development Update

FOUNDATION LEADERSHIP

Virgil Scott, CFRE, President/CEO

Scott was appointed president of the University of Northern Colorado Foundation in May 2006 after a national search. Prior to joining the Foundation, Scott served as the president and CEO of the Fort Hays State University Endowment Association in Hays, Kan. At Fort Hays State, Scott provided leadership for the Centennial Campaign, a \$36 million comprehensive capital campaign that surpassed the original goal of \$30 million. He also headed the efforts to raise \$5.6 million for the Robbins Alumni and Endowment Center, which will serve FHSU's 38,000 alumni. During Scott's tenure the association's assets grew from \$15 million to \$42 million while \$31 million was distributed to the university for scholarships and programming.

Prior to joining Fort Hays State in 1994, Scott was a marketing and advertising executive with 12 years of advertising agency and media sales experience, primarily in the Topeka, Kan. market. He graduated from Fort Hays State with a degree in Communication in 1981 and received Certified Fundraising Executive certification in 2004. Scott's wife, Diane, received her PhD in College Student Personnel Administration from the University of Northern Colorado in 1995. An active volunteer, Scott recently served as Vice Chair of the Kansas Area United Methodist Foundation and as a member of the State of Kansas Crime Victims' Grant Review Board. Also, Scott has served on the CASE District VI Conference Planning Committee the past 3 years.

Kevin Bean, Vice President for Major Gifts & Special Campaigns

Bean joined the foundation in July 2004 and currently manages all aspects of fundraising, including major gifts, planned giving, the annual fund and donor relations. Prior to joining the foundation, Bean was interim executive director for the Fredonia College Foundation and assistant vice president for advancement and college relations at SUNY Fredonia in Fredonia, NY. Bean has also held advancement positions at Lafayette College, in Easton, Penn., and Trocaire College, in Buffalo, NY. Kevin and his wife, Carole, live in Greeley with their two sons.
