Notes

This handout should not be used as a substitute for advising or as a substitute for the description of the Psychology Major in the UNC Catalog.

In order to graduate in four years, you are advised to take an average of 15 credits per semester. These credits fall into three categories: Liberal Arts Core, Psychology Major, and University-Wide Electives. University-Wide Electives may take the form of another major, a minor, or additional Psychology credits. Psychology majors are not required to have a minor. Your advisor can suggest a particular set of electives in response to your interests and objectives.

School of Psychological Sciences faculty recommend that PSY 300 (Research Methods in Psychology) be taken as soon as possible after PSY 200 (Psychological Statistics and Design). Students considering graduate school are encouraged to consider available advance seminars for majors only in psychology.

The School of Psychological Sciences offers courses in the summer and interim sessions. Students are encouraged to take summer or interim classes as a means of expediting their degree program or as a means of catching up from semesters in which fewer than an average of 15 credits per semester have been taken.
