

Time to Completion

The doctoral program in school psychology is completed in an average of 4 years (Mdn.= 3 years 2 semesters) for students entering with a master’s degree, Ed.S. degree, or advanced coursework in a mental health field, and 6 years (Mdn.= 6 years) for students entering with a bachelor’s degree. The following table provides more information about completion timelines:

Licensure

Graduates of the Ph.D. program are eligible for licensure as psychologists as well as school psychologists. School Psychology licensure is required for practice as school psychologists in public school settings, and psychology licensure is required for practice outside of schools. In the past 10 years, 21% of our graduates have obtained licensure as psychologists, and 96% are licensed/certified school psychologists. (updated February 2012)
