THE STRYKER INSTITUTE FOR LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT

The Stryker Institute for Leadership Development was created at the University of Northern Colorado in 2001 through the generosity of the Ronda E. Stryker and William D. Johnston Foundation, and with firm support from the University itself. Ronda Stryker, an alumna of the university, envisioned her contribution to enable and empower non-traditional aged women from underrepresented groups in obtaining their college degrees and in cultivating their leadership capabilities.

The Institute provides students with leadership seminars, a tuition scholarship, opportunities to exercise their emerging leadership skills, and a sustained program of support.

Stryker is 40 members strong, with 20 returning from previous cohorts and 20 first year participants. The Institute guides developing leaders in their quest to inspire, manage, motivate and communicate with others. The Stryker Institute contributes directly to the mission of our university by supporting the education and professional advancement of traditionally underrepresented and non-traditional aged women.
