National Woman's Rights Convention The first convention on women's

The first convention on women's rights was held in 1848 in Seneca Falls, New York. Inspired by this convention, the first National Women's Rights Convention was held in 1850.

The National Woman's Rights Convention was an annual event that helped raise awareness on women's rights in the 19th century.

Founded by Lucy Stone,
Lucretia Mott and Abby Kelley, the
first convention was held Oct. 23–24,
1850 in Worcester, Massachusetts. The
convention drew 1,000 people of both
genders, and gained national
attention.

Annual national conferences where held through 1860, and where placed in various cities on the eastern coast.




