



CDE Expands Official Teacher

You May Now Be Eligible for \$10K in Financial

In August 2022, the State Board of Education confirmed the 2022–23 Educator Shortage Areas.

Based on district reports of unfilled or hard-to-fill positions last school year and updated guidance from the federal government regarding how to calculate shortage areas, the list of shortage areas has expanded. This change may increase the number of educator candidates

Applicants must already be enrolled in a state-approved preparation program to qualify. For the 2022–23 school year thus far, the Colorado Department of Education has awarded \$3.2 million of ERR Program funds to more than 500 educators. The CDE has received a large number of requests and is spending down available funds quickly, so qualifying applicants


