# **Rural Student Teacher Stipends Are Changing Lives** The Colorado Center for Rural Education and the Colorado Department of Higher Education work together to help alleviate the teacher shortage in rural Colorado school

districts. To that end, we award \$4,000 stipends to qualifying student teachers who wish to complete their student teaching in one of Colorado's 146 rural districts. Stipend recipients are expected to apply to and work in a rural school district after

completing their student teaching. Three of the fall 2021 recipients shared their thoughts about how the award will help them achieve their goals in the upcoming year.

If you're a special services provider, such as a school counselor, audiologist, or nurse, who is interested in working in a rural Colorado school, we encourage you to apply for the Special Services Provider Stipend (SSPS). The SSPS provides recipients with up to \$6,000 to pay for a variety of program-related costs during their final clinical experience


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
