Their efforts cover a diverse array of initiatives. For example, they have <u>developed systems to teach</u> and assess 21st century skills in Colorado's rural districts and <u>enhanced work-based learning opportunities for rural Nebraska high schoolers</u>. They also supported a teacher recruitment work-group in rural Alaska by analyzing paraprofessional-to-teacher programs around the country.

Since 2021, Marzano Research has partnered with the <u>Colorado Center for Rural Education</u> (CCRE) in the area of rural education. Their work with CCRE includes conducting data analyses, <u>evaluating the CCRE rural teacher stipend program</u>, and creating resources to share the findings with stakeholders.

Colorado Rural Student Teaching Stipend applications for fall 2024 accepted: December 1, 2023, through March 31, 2024

National Board Certified Teacher Stipend applications for 2024 accepted: January 1, 2024, through April 30, 2024

Rural Inservice Educator Stipend applications for fall 2024 accepted: May 1, 2024, through August 31, 2024

Colorado Rural Student Teaching Stipend applications for spring 2025 accepted: July 1, 2024, through October 31, 2024

Applications are currently being accepted for the **Colorado Substitute Stipend**. Funding is limited, and the program will end this summer.

Now Accepting Applications!

Apply for the fall 2024 Colorado Rural Student Teaching Stipend by March 31, 2024!

This stipend is up to \$4,000 for the semester of student teaching in a Colorado rural school district. Recipients are expected to apply to and work in a rural school district after completing their student teaching.

Apply for the National Board-Certified Teacher Stipend by April 30, 2024!

This stipend is \$4,250, which is the amount needed to (a) enroll with the National Board; (b) register for each of the four components of the National Board portfolio; and (c) participate in the Rural National Board Cohort. All NBCT stipend recipients receive support and mentorship from NBCT facilitators in a Colorado Rural National Board cohort. Recipients must commit to remaining in a rural setting for three years after becoming a National Board candidate.

Both stipends are offered by the <u>Colorado Center for Rural Education</u> in collaboration with the <u>Colorado Department of Higher Education</u>.
