LOGISTICAL INFORMATION

ARRIVING IN DENVER

If you are flying to Denver you will want to fly into Denver International Airport (DIA).
Greeley is about an hour north of DIA.

- Students and staff are responsible for their own transportation to and from the UNC Campus.
 - Shuttle service from DIA to the UNC Greeley campus is available through *Denver Super Shuttle*- <http://www.supershuttle.com/Greeley.aspx>.
 - It is recommended that you make reservations ahead of time.
 - There will also be local cabs and other shuttle services that are available at DIA; the cost and choice are yours.
- All transportation services are located on Level 4 outside the main terminal.
- If you are driving to the campus, go to <http://www.unco.edu/uncmap/> for directions.
- For those of you who will be without a vehicle while you are in Greeley, there are a few options if you wish to venture out and see more of the area. Please visit <http://www.greeleycvb.com> for more information on the Greeley area and public transportation.

LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

Students participating in the Consecutive Interpreting advanced training may choose to stay on the campus of UNC in Greeley or make other accommodation arrangements.

- The on-campus accommodation package price is \$759
- Students who choose to stay on campus will be staying in New West Campus Residence Hall-North and must comply with the UNC Residential Hall rules and regulations (see rules section). This Residence Hall is the newest and most modern of the UNC halls.
 - Each student must register individually for a room at www.unco.edu/summerconf.
 - Students will be notified when the UNC Summer Conferencing website is open for reservations. The anticipated date is early May, 2010.
 - If you have a suitemate preference you will be able to designate this person when you register.
- Students who choose to make alternative living arrangements are responsible for coordinating their accommodations independently.

NEW WEST CAMPUS RESIDENCE HALL - NORTH

- New West Campus Residence Hall - North is designed as multi-person suites.
- Each suite has two bedrooms, a shared bathroom, and a small shared living area.
- On each floor there is a fully equipped community kitchen and eating area.
- All rooms are air-conditioned and have basic furniture.
- Bed linens, a blanket and pillow, a towel and washcloth, small hand soap, one roll of toilet paper, and a cup will be provided by the Residence Hall.
- This is a typical college dorm room, so bring whatever you might need that will make your stay more comfortable: e.g., favorite blanket, pictures of family, alarm clock, shampoo, additional soap, tissues, etc.
- There is a lounge area available for watching TV in the Residence Hall.
- There is a coin operated laundry facility in the Residence Hall.
- The Residence Hall is within a couple of blocks walking distance to your classrooms. Please give yourself plenty of time to walk at your own pace and arrive to class on time. Remember and allow for altitude affects. We are about a mile high here!
- There is a *King Soopers* (local grocery store chain) about three city blocks away and there are fast food options close by if you want something in addition to your dining hall options.

Residence Hall Check In/Out

- **Check in:** New West Campus Residence Hall - North will be open for student check in one day prior to classes starting (Sunday, July 18th).
- **Check out:** You can check out of the Residence Hall anytime after 5:00 PM on the last day of class. Please keep in mind when you are making your departure flight plans that you must arrive at DIA at least two hours prior to your time of departure and it takes approximately 1 - 1.5 hours in good traffic to arrive at DIA from Greeley. All students must be checked out no later than noon on Saturday, July 31st.

UNC Residence Hall Rules

Yes, there are some rules you must follow while staying in the dorms. Disregarding these rules may result in a dismissal from the Residence Hall and/or advanced training.

- Children and other family members are not allowed to stay in the Residence Hall.
- No pets are allowed in the Residence Hall.
- Any damage to the dorms, furnishings, and other contents is your responsibility. Normal wear and tear is not considered "damage" to the Residence Hall.
- If you do not have homeowner's insurance, you should consider purchasing renter's insurance if your personal property is a concern (i.e., if you bring a computer, expensive jewelry, etc.).
- Small personal appliances such as microwaves, coffee pots, popcorn poppers and irons are allowed.

DINING ON CAMPUS

- The Holmes Dining Hall is located across the courtyard from the New West Campus Residence Hall – North. Meals are included for all Consecutive Interpreting students who purchase the accommodation package. Dining Room swipe cards will be available when you check into the Residence Hall. Be sure to check out the Dining Hall website for operating times as they are on a modified summer schedule. Meals included in the package are as follows:

Breakfast: Monday, July 19th – Saturday, July 31st

Lunch: Monday, July 19th – Tuesday July 27th

Courtroom experiential learning sessions will be Wednesday, July 28th – Friday, July 30th. Students will be responsible for their own lunches on these days.

Dinner: Sunday, July 18th – Friday, July 30th

PARKING ON CAMPUS

All parking areas on the UNC campus require an official UNC parking permit.

- If you stay in the Residence Hall, you will receive a parking permit as part of the accommodation package.
- For students who choose alternative living arrangement, you will need to purchase a parking pass when you arrive on campus. Daily parking permits are \$6.00 per day.

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Students are expected to bring their own computer, preferably with DVD playback capability as your course work will involve the viewing of DVD's. If your computer does not have DVD playback capability it would be in your best interest to bring a DVD player.
- Students staying in New West Campus Residence Hall - North will have wireless Internet access as part of their accommodation package. If your laptop is not equipped with wireless access you will need supply your own Ethernet cord.

ATTIRE

- Business-casual attire is expected, for both students and staff during class sessions. Appropriate attire is expected for the three days of courtroom experiential learning.
- Shorts, jeans, bib overalls, flip flop beach sandals or other such casual wear is not acceptable. There are often visitors to the programs during summers, and we want to foster our recognition as working professionals. Dressing according to the professional status we seek will let those with whom we have contact know how seriously we approach our work and learning.
- At the same time, this is a college campus that will require walking from point to point, so be sure to have comfortable walking shoes.
- Also, a reminder that the Colorado weather can change quickly and classrooms are often cool. Dressing in layers is suggested.

CAMPUS RECREATION CENTER

Students who purchase the accommodations package will have UNC Recreation privileges while on campus.

- More than 7,000 square feet of strength and conditioning spaces, featuring weight machines, free weights, treadmills, steppers, ellipticals, upright and recumbent bikes, an upper-body cycle, and rowing machines
- Two multi-purpose gymnasiums, featuring a total of 5 hardwood basketball courts
- An indoor, 1/10 mile, walking/jogging track
- Three racquetball/wallyball courts
- An indoor climbing wall
- A group fitness and exercise room
- Locker rooms
