ARRIVING IN DENVER

If you are flying to Denver you will want to fly into Denver International Airport (DIA). Greeley is about an hour north of DIA.

- Students and staff are responsible for their own transportation to get to the UNC Campus.
 - Shuttle service from DIA to the UNC Greeley campus is available through *Denver Super Shuttle*- <http://www.supershuttle.com/Greeley.aspx> .
 - It is recommended that you make reservations ahead of time.
 - There will also be local cabs and other shuttle services that are available at DIA; the cost and choice are yours.
- All transportation services are located on level 4 outside the main terminal.
- If you are driving to the campus, go to <http://www.unco.edu/uncoemap/> for directions.
- For those of you who will be without a vehicle while you are in Greeley, there are a few options if you wish to venture out and see more of the area. LIVING ARRANGEMENTS

UNC - DO IT Center BA students/staff can choose to stay on the campus of UNC in Greeley or make other arrangements. EICP students are required to stay at UNC Lawrenson Hall.

- DO IT Center students/staff that choose to stay on campus will be staying in Lawrenson Hall and must comply with the UNC Residential Hall rules and regulations (see rules section).
 - **Each student must register for a room online at www.unco.edu/summerconf.**
 - Students will be notified when the UNC Summer Conferencing website is open for reservations.
 - If you have a suitemate preference you will be able to designate this person when you register.
- DO IT Center students/staff who choose to make alternative living arrangements will be responsible for coordinating these logistics independently.

LAWRENSON HALL

- Lawrenson Hall is designed as a two bedroom suite.
- Each suite has two bedrooms (each with two twin beds), a shared bathroom, a shared living-dining area, and a small kitchen with a stove, refrigerator and sink.
- The 2009 rate for a shared suite (two people per suite) is \$36.65 per person/per night and includes Internet hookup and a parking pass. (The per night room rate will increase slightly for summer 2010)
- All rooms are air-conditioned and have basic furniture.
- Bed linens, a blanket and pillow, a towel and washcloth, small hand soap, one roll of toilet paper, and a cup will be provided for you by the Residence Hall.
- This is a typical college dorm room, so bring whatever you might need that will make your stay more comfortable: e.g., favorite blanket, pictures of family, alarm clock, shampoo, additional soap, dish soap, toilet paper, tissues, dishes, etc.
- You will have the option, when you register for your room, to rent:
 - A basic cookware package (\$10.00) if you would prefer not to bring these items with you.
 - In addition to a refrigerator in the kitchen, UNC has a small microwave to rent if this is something that you want or if you would like a personal unit in your bedroom. The rental fee for renting the microwave is \$30.00.
- TV cable connection is available in each dorm suite, but you need to bring your own cable connection cord. There is also a lounge available for watching TV in the Residence Hall.
- There are coin operated laundry facilities in the Residence Hall.
- The dorm is within a couple of blocks walking distance to your classrooms in McKee Hall. Please give yourself plenty of time to walk it at your own pace and arrive to class on time.
- There is a *King Soopers* (local grocery store chain) about three city blocks away.

Residence Hall Check In/Out

- Check in: Lawrenson Hall will be open for student check in one day prior to classes starting.
- Check out: You can check out of the Residence Hall anytime **after 5:00 PM on the last day of class**. Please keep in mind when you are making your departure flight plans that you must arrive at DIA at least two hours prior to your time of departure flight and it takes approximately 1 - 1.5 hours in good traffic to arrive at DIA from Greeley.
- All students/staff must be checked out no later than noon one day after the last day of class.

UNC Lawrenson Hall Rules

Yes, there are some rules you must follow while staying in the dorms. Disregarding these rules may result in a dismissal from the Residence Hall and/or the program.

- Children and other family members are not allowed to stay in the dorms.
- No pets are allowed in the dorms.
- Any damage to the dorms, furnishings, and other contents is your responsibility. (Normal wear and tear is not considered "damage" to the dorm.)
- If you do not have homeowner's insurance, you should consider purchasing renter's insurance if your personal property is a concern to you (i.e., if you bring a computer, expensive jewelry, etc.).
- Small personal appliances such as microwaves, coffee pots, popcorn poppers and irons are allowed.

MAIL

If you are staying on campus, you may have your mail sent to you at Lawrenson Hall.

- Do not send medication through the mail
- Do not send valuables

TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Students are expected to bring their own computer, preferably with DVD playback capability as your course work will involve the recording and viewing of DVD's. If your computer does not have DVD playback capability it would be in your best interest to bring a TV/DVD combo.
- Students are expected to have a FLIP camera for recording their work. FLIP cameras are available at the UNC Book Stop: <http://www.thebookstop.com/>.
- For those students that will not have computer access, computers will be available, but with limited hours, in the UNC Michener Library: <http://www.unco.edu/library/> or at the University Center: <http://www.unco.edu/uc/>.
- Students staying in Lawrenson Hall will have Internet access; however students need to supply their own Ethernet cord. (The rooms are not wireless).

ATTIRE

- **Business-casual attire** will be expected, for both students and staff.
- Shorts, jeans, bib overalls, flip flop beach sandals or other such casual wear will not be acceptable. There are often visitors to the program during summers, and we want to foster our recognition as working professionals. Dressing according to the professional status we seek will let those with whom we have contact know how seriously we approach our work and learning.
- At the same time, this is a college campus that will require walking from point to point, so be sure to have comfortable walking shoes.
- Also, a reminder that the Colorado weather can change quickly and classrooms are often cool. Dressing in layers is suggested.
