Faculty Senate Policy Proposal

Subject: Resolution in support of RSCW

Originator/Date: FSEC, for senate discussion on 1/29/2024

Placement(s): None; to be sent as information item to university administration.

Purpose/Rationale: With recent added scrutiny on all university travel, Faculty Senate wants to reaffirm our position that faculty travel for the purpose of dissemination of research, scholarship, and creative works is *essential* for all faculty whose workload includes professional activity.

Proposed Language:

Research, Scholarship, and Creative Works are essential to the mission of the University of Northern Colorado. The Board Adopted Mission Values states that, "The University strives to be a leading student-centered university that promotes effective teaching, lifelong learning, the advancement of knowledge, research, and a commitment to service." Promoting the "advancement of knowledge" and research is also explicitly cited in the 2030 Rowing Not Drifting strategic plan, wherein it is affirmed that, "Scholarship is an essential part of informed learning occurring in and out of the classroom." As a university that adopts the teacher/scholar model, scholarship is a fundamental component of promoting excellence in teaching and is required to make the university truly Students First.

Foundational to scholarship is its dissemination. A primary method of dissemination is through participation at academic conferences and related venues. Beyond the immediate contribution to advancement of knowledge, being an active participant at such conferences has benefits to the faculty member's career, the university's reputation, and the students the faculty member teaches and advises. Connections formed at conferences can lead to new research and grant collaborations as well as student recruitment. Knowledge gained at conferences keeps faculty informed of the latest advances in their field, including pedagogical practices that can directly impact student success.

UNC has a long history of supporting its faculty with the resources required to perform their assigned duties. We commend the university for centering this support as one of the five key pillars of its



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strategic plan: *Enhance and Invest*. Further, we support the university's efforts for fiscal responsibility which allows for this continued support. These strategic budgeting efforts provide an opportunity to reaffirm our core values and realign our support toward those initiatives essential to our mission. We therefore urge the university to preserve its encouragement and support, through the prioritization of resources, for research, scholarship, and creative works, together with their dissemination.
