



International Graduate Online Instructions

Thank you for your interest in graduate study at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC)! We look forward to helping you pursue your educational goals. The simple student-administered step-by-step process is described below. If you have questions, please contact the Graduate School and International Admissions at (970) 351-2831, Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m.

You will receive online acknowledgement of your application upon receipt. Graduate admission at UNC is a three-stage process, first to the Graduate School, then to the program area for review by faculty and then back to the Graduate School. To ensure timely processing, you must submit **ALL** materials required for admission screening along with the non-refundable \$60 application fee made payable to UNC Graduate School.

Listed below are basic requirements for Graduate School admission.

Step 1. Complete the Application Form

All sections of the application must be completed before it can be submitted. And, the electronic application cannot be submitted until you have paid the application fee of \$60 by credit card or indicated you will send payment separately. You must then receive confirmation from the on-line administrator that your application has been successfully submitted.

Step 2. Obtain Official Transcripts

All applicants are required to provide one official transcript, mark sheets, diplomas and certificates from every accredited college or university attended since completing high school, except UNC. Official transcripts from each college are required, even if courses taken at one institution are listed on another school's transcripts. If they are not in English, submit a notarized English translation with each document. Transcripts should be mailed to:

Step 3. Document your English Proficiency. Documentation accepted:

- a. TOEFL score – 550 Paper Based Test (PBT), 213 Computer Based Test (CBT), 80 Internet Based Test (IBT); Intensive English Language Test (IELT) of 7; submitted to UNC from testing agency. UNC school code is 4074.
- b. Completion of a degree program from an accredited US institution within the previous two years.
- c. Students without the above can apply for admission to UNC's Intensive English Language Program.

Step 4. If applicable: Submit Graduate Record Examination Scores (GRE)

No doctoral applications are reviewed for admission without the GRE test scores. Applicants for master's degree programs should review the UNC Catalog (<http://catalog.unco.edu/>) or contact their degree program coordinator to determine if GRE scores are required. You must request official scores to be sent from the Educational Testing Service to the UNC Graduate School. You can call ETS at (609) 771-7670 in NJ, or (510) 873-8100 in CA. **UNC's institutional code number is R4074.** If available, an *unofficial copy* of scores can be enclosed with a written request to evaluate pending receipt of official scores. All GRE general test scores must be no more than five years old at the date of your application.

Step 5. Obtain Letters of Recommendation

Letters of recommendation are required for Doctoral and Interdisciplinary degree program applicants. Obtain three letters of recommendation from persons who can attest to your academic potential and abilities. You may download the generic Letter of Recommendation form (<http://www.unco.edu/grad/forms/student.html>) from our website or check with your program area graduate coordinator to determine whether this form will be accepted or if they require a different form. Most masters programs require letters of recommendation as well. Check with your program to determine if they require letters of recommendation and if they accept the Graduate School Letter of Recommendation form.

Step 6. Provide Copy of Passport and Student Visa (if have one)

International Students must obtain F-1 or J-1 visas to study in the United States. Before UNC can issue visa documents (forms I-20 or DS-2019) to admitted students, we must receive: 1) financial documents verifying funding to support the cost of attending UNC, and 2) copies of the biopage of your passport and your student visa (if you have one).

Step 7. Check Department/Program Requirements - (Do this prior to submitting your application.)

Programs may have additional requirements, procedures or deadlines. It is the applicant's responsibility to contact the program area offering the degree and/or educator licensure program(s) to which you are seeking admission to determine if additional materials or procedures are required. Please note: some programs screen applications once a year. ***In the case of any program area deadlines, your application MUST BE RECEIVED by the Graduate School at least 20 working days prior to the program deadline. If there is no program deadline, you should plan on submitting your application at least 60 days prior to your projected enrollment date to ensure adequate processing time.*** A completed application normally takes four to six weeks to process. For applications for Interdisciplinary programs, allow extra time for processing and review. Your application will not be evaluated for admission until it is complete, including required test scores, if any. Failure to submit all required materials may delay evaluation of your application.

Step 8. Submit All Required Application Materials to the Graduate School
