PROPOSALS REVIEWED

- BIO** **Biological Education Ph.D.**
Additional courses added to the advanced electives and research core areas of the program and added two sentences under research tools area.
Committee recommended approval by consensus.
- SES 221** **Biomechanics**
This course was renumbered to SES 331.
Committee recommended approval by consensus.
- SCED 535** **Context-based Conceptual Chemistry**
A new course designed for the MA in Natural Science Teaching Program that will primarily be taught online.
Committee recommended approval by consensus.
- REC 232** **Recreation and Tourism Leadership**
Changes in the program occurred in 2006 but the titles of the courses were not changed at that time. This change is to rectify that error. Adding “and Tourism” to the title of the course.
- REC 251** **Leisure, Recreation and the Older Adult**
This course has not been taught for six years and does not fit in the program since it was changed to Recreation and Tourism in 2006.

- REC 394** **Practicum in Recreation and Tourism**
Catalog description corrections, course content update and new syllabus to reflect the changes to the program that were made in 2006 by adding “and Tourism” to the program name and deleting the Therapeutic Recreation emphasis.

- REC 451** **Administration of Leisure Delivery Systems**
Catalog description corrections, course content update and new syllabus to reflect the changes to the program that were made in 2006 by adding “and Tourism” to the program name and deleting the Therapeutic Recreation emphasis.
