Title: Assistant/Associate Professor, Community Health

**Job Summary**

Assistant Professor (tenure-track) or Associate Professor (tenure-eligible), 9-month appointment in the Community Health program at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC). The Community Health program offers an MPH as one of three partner institutions that make up the CEPH accredited Colorado School of Public Health (CSPH). All faculty members in the Community Health program are eligible for appointment as adjunct faculty of the University of Colorado Denver in the Colorado School of Public Health. Faculty members in Community Health also collaborate with the Gerontology and Human Rehabilitation programs at UNC to offer an undergraduate degree in Human Services. The position requires undergraduate and graduate teaching and advising, including supervision of graduate research, scholarly activity, development of external funding and service to the program, CSPH, school, college, university and profession.

**Minimum Qualifications**

This position requires an earned Doctorate in Health Education, Public Health or a closely related field at the time of application, experience in public health practice, ability to teach courses in core public health areas, demonstrated excellence in university teaching and student mentorship, and evidence of focused research and the ability to secure external funding.

**Preferred Qualifications**

Preference will be given to applicants with evidence of one or more of the following qualifications: MPH/DrPH degree, expertise in cultural competence and working with marginalized populations, experience developing interdisciplinary academic and community partnerships, experience in program development and evaluation, experience in curriculum development, experience in program leadership, active involvement with regional/national professional organizations.

**Salary and Benefits**

Salary is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits available include health, life, and dental insurance, as well as a selection of several defined contribution retirement programs. Dependents and spouses of UNC employees who are employed as 0.5 FTE or above are entitled to and eligible for Dependent Tuition Grants. These tuition grants will cover in-state tuition charges. Further requirements may exist. Other benefits may be available based on position. Opportunities for summer instruction may be available.
