Required Qualifications

Earned doctorate in health education or health related field and a background in public health with the ability to teach courses in core public health areas. Evidence of teaching, scholarship, and professional service.

Preferred Qualifications

Evidence of effective university teaching using a variety of teaching methods, successful grant application, willingness to advise students, and experience with collaborative/outreach partnerships on a campus and surrounding community.

Position Description: This is a full-time, nine-month tenure-track appointment in the CEPH accredited MPH Program located in the School of Human Sciences, within the College of Natural and Health Sciences at the University of Northern Colorado. The successful candidate will have the opportunity to work with the Colorado School of Public Health. The planned Colorado School of Public Health will be a joint endeavor among the University of Colorado at Denver and Health Sciences Center, Colorado State University, and the University of Northern Colorado to open the region's first and only collaborative school of public health in July 2008 to be accredited by 2010. Once open, the collaborative school will serve the needs of the public health workforce and the diverse communities in the Rocky Mountain region by incorporating public health graduate degree program at each of the three institutions with distance learning, continuing education, community outreach and public health research. Responsibilities: Typically teach 9 credit hours in graduate and undergraduate courses in core public health areas; conduct independent and collaborative research; seek and maintain extramural funding; advise and supervise undergraduate and graduate research; serve on school and university committees.

Applicants must submit a letter of application, which addresses specific areas of teaching/research competence, graduate school transcripts (unofficial are acceptable at this point), curriculum vitae, and the names, with accompanying contact information (name, title, address, email address, & telephone number), of three references. Candidates will be selected based on a comparison of qualifications and school needs. Original transcripts must be submitted within one (1) month of hire.

Satisfactory completion of a background check, educational check, and authorization to work in the United States is required after a conditional offer of employment has been made.
