## 'Hi' Bridge Is Presented by CSCE Seniors

The gift of the class of 1940 to Colorado State College of Education, the "Hi" bridge, was officially presented at ceremonies Tuesday morning at 11 o'clock preceding the annual senior assembly on the campus.

The bridge, made of buff brick to harmonize with the exterior of the student-union, leads from the quad to the northwest corner of Bru-Inn. A great share of the campus traffic to and from the union, passes over the bridge. The gift was presented by Ann Brothers, senior president, on behalf of the class. "With this gift, is established the tradition that persons meeting upon this bridge, friend or stranger, are to greet each other with a cordial greeting, "hi." Hence the name "Hi" bridge.
