



## Office of Engagement

How to identify Engaged Teaching and Learning Scholarship (ETLS) or Engaged Scholarship (ES) in Digital Measures.

1. Sign into Digital Measures through URSA
2. Under Activities go to the Research/Scholarship/Creative Works section; select a field.
3. Enter required information
4. Determine if the RSCW is considered ETLS or ES. Consulting the '?' for Carnegie Classification descriptors
5. Select which type applies from the drop-down menu (Figure 1)
6. Complete information in other fields and SUBMIT (Figure 2)

The popup lists two categories:

- Engaged Teaching and Learning Scholarship (ETLS)**: Faculty scholarship (RSCW) associated with their teaching and learning and curricular engagement achievements in connection with service learning or community-based courses. This includes scholarly products on topics such as, but not limited to curriculum development, assessment of student learning in the community, action research conducted within a course, etc., that have been disseminated to others through scholarly venues as illustrated in the description. (i.e. research studies, conference presentations, pedagogy workshops, publications, etc.)
- Engaged Scholarship (ES)**: Faculty scholarship (RSCW) that contributes to the generation and construction of new knowledge and theory development that is associated with their community engagement and partnership activities. This includes but is not limited to research studies of partnerships, documentation of community response to outreach/engagement programs, or other evaluations or studies of impacts and outcomes of partnership activities (i.e. scholarly reports, academic and/or professional presentations, technical reports, research reports, policy reports, publications, etc.)?
