Honors Program Deadlines

New student application deadlines

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

- December 10 Early Action, Priority Consideration
- March 10 Regular Decision, Priority Deadline for the Honors Residential Community

TRANSFER STUDENTS

- November 1 Spring Semester, Priority Consideration
- March 1 Fall Semester, Priority Consideration

Limited space is available for students who qualify. Apply early!

No minimum GPA. Test scores are not required. Open to all academic programs.

Preference is given to students who demonstrate intellectual curiosity and a motivation to think critically and creatively.

You can apply to the Honors Program through your UNC Admissions Portal. You will find a separate Honors application on the portal that requires additional shortanswer essays.

Remember, the Honors Program is competitive. To increase the likelihood of being admitted into the Honors Program and for eligibility for Honors Heidger Scholarships, apply by the early-action deadline of December 10 immediately after applying for admission to UNC.

Applications are accepted after December 10, with priority deadline of March 10. Admission into the program requires that you answer several short essay questions, which can be found on the Honors Program website. After March 10, we will accept applications from well-qualified students on an as-available basis.

THE OFFICE OF UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH (OUR) provides support and recognition for undergraduate student research and creative endeavors for all colleges at the University of Northern Colorado. OUR provides numerous opportunities and support services.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH AND CREATIVE WORKS offers stipends up to \$2,500 per semester for students engaged in research or creative endeavors.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH AND CREATIVE WORKS PRESENTATION OPPORTUNITIES hosts the Fall

Undergraduate Symposium and the Student Showcase of Artists and Scholars to exhibit students' work and creativity.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH MENTORSHIP PROGRAM offers funding and support for graduate students to mentor undergraduates in their research and creative projects.

NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH

allows Honors students to present their work alongside other students from across the country in a unique environment to celebrate and promote undergraduate student achievement.

UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH JOURNAL provides Honors students a chance to submit their work to be considered for publication in this interdisciplinary journal featuring research, scholarly articles, creative writing, artwork and photography.

Scholarships & Fellowships

Pay for your education with scholarships or fellowships

The Honors Program offers several **scholarships**, specifically for Honors students, made possible by the generosity of past Honors faculty, directors, alumni and friends of the Honors Program. These scholarships are offered for specific majors and are designated for full-time, active Honors students with high levels of achievement and academic engagement.

HONORS SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded based on a student's progression through the Honors curriculum with high academic achievement and who has completed two semesters at UNC.

BECKY R. EDGERTON MEMORIAL HONORS SCHOLARSHIP—

Supports an Honors student who has completed a meritorious thesis and demonstrates the greatest breadth of intellectual curiosity that distinguishes them from their Honors peers.

PAUL HEIDGER SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded to a student who is studying or plans to study the sciences with preference given to exceptional students during their freshman year.

BARBARA HEIDGER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP-

Given to a student who was previously involved with or has expressed an interest in International Studies with preference given to exceptional students during their freshman year.

GREGORY E. AND DEBRAK. HOLMAN SCHOLARSHIP-

Supports a full-time, first-generation student who has demonstrated evidence of active civic or community engagement, with preference given to students involved in environmental advocacy, environmental education or cultural resource preservation.

EUGENE D. AND PEGGY J. KOPLITZ SCHOLARSHIP—Awarded to an Honors student during their senior year who has produced the best proposal for a senior Honors research thesis.

MARIE LIVINGSTON HONORS SCHOLARSHIP—Supports students with a 3.25 GPA or higher who have completed at least two semesters at UNC.

Supported and championed by UNC friends Bob and Bonnie Phelps Family, the CAP Awards recognize students with up to a \$10,000 annual scholarship. The CAP Awards recognize UNC juniors and seniors whose lives demonstrate an exceptional and exemplary personal commitment to the following values:

ADMISSION-BASED SCHOLARSHIP **OPPORTUNITIES**

Your general UNC admission application simultaneously considers you for merit-based scholarships that are automatically awarded based on your academic performance. Be sure to complete your UNC admission application by March 1 to be considered for these scholarships.

All Honors students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and UNC's Universal Scholarship Application to be eligible for these scholarships.
