# Discover Your Home Away from Home

Over a dozen residence halls and one apartment complex to choose from.

Finding a place to call home is exciting, and we're here to help support you every step of the way. Here are some steps to help you find a place that best fits you.



## NAVIGATING THE HOUSING PROCESS

Use the checklist below to help guide you through the campus housing process.\*

### EXPLORE YOUR HOUSING OPTIONS

You have plenty of options to find your ideal space! Check out room layouts in this brochure or view walk-through tours online at [unco.edu/living-on-campus](https://unco.edu/living-on-campus). Your college home should feel like the right fit. Take time to explore your options and think about what matters most to you — room layout, amenities, and how close you'll be to dining, classes or your favorite campus spots.

### APPLY FOR HOUSING

To apply for on-campus housing, complete the housing contract starting in December at [unco.edu/housing](https://unco.edu/housing) and pay the application fee. If you qualify, you may be able to postpone the fee.

### REQUEST DISABILITY-RELATED ACCOMMODATIONS (AS NEEDED)

If you need accommodations, UNC's Office of Housing & Residential Education and the Disability Resource Center work together to review requests, based on medical information and disability documentation. The priority deadline to submit requests is June 1. Questions? Contact [drc@unco.edu](mailto:drc@unco.edu).

### FIND YOUR OWN ROOM AND ROOMMATE

After completing your housing contract, you can choose your room and roommates starting in March through the UNC housing portal. Use the roommate matching tool, **RoomeeZ**, to connect with other Bears who share similar lifestyles, then pick your residence hall, and exact room for you and your future roommates to share. Pro-tip: Create a roommate group in RoomeeZ to make finding a space for everyone in your group fast and easy!

### CHOOSE A MEAL PLAN

UNC meal plans offer you convenience and flexibility. Grab a quick coffee, snack between classes or enjoy a full meal. You can select your meal plan starting in late July. For first-year students living on campus, a meal plan is required. Learn more at [unco.edu/dining](https://unco.edu/dining).

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING REQUIREMENT

All first-year students who are under the age of 21 are required to live on-campus for one year. If you meet the local area requirements\*\*, you may be able to request to live at home with your legal guardian instead.

# Find Your Community

A sense of community makes life easier while pursuing your studies.

We've created three neighborhoods with **more than a dozen unique halls, houses and apartments** to help you feel at home and supported during your time here. Each neighborhood offers these helpful services:

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CENTER

A space to meet friends, explore campus resources, develop new skills, and join fun events and activities hosted by your community.

## FRONT DESK OPERATIONS

- Open seven days a week, 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. The front desk is here to help with:
- Lockouts (if you're locked out of your room).
  - Picking up packages and mail.
  - Access to cleaning supplies, cooking items and gaming equipment.
  - Submitting requests for repairs or tech help.
  - Connecting you with Residence Hall staff.
  - Assistance with room moves or housing questions.

## STUDENT STAFF

Our Resident Assistants (RAs) and other student staff members are here to build community and help you transition smoothly to UNC.

## PROFESSIONAL STAFF

# Places to Live and Learn

## BASIN NEIGHBORHOOD

Situated closest to UNC’s athletic facilities, the Outdoor Pursuits hub and the Campus Recreation Center, the Basin Neighborhood is great for students who want to be close to the action. Within walking distance, students can also find spots to study, dine or socialize, such as the César Chávez Cultural Center, Michener Library and Holmes Dining Hall.

**HARRISON HALL** — With five floors and 540+ students, Harrison Hall houses the majority of our first-year students. Home to a pet friendly community and near UNC’s Outdoor Pursuits program, Harrison Hall provides easy access to equipment check out for your next Outdoor Pursuits adventure.

**TURNER HALL** — The second tallest building in Greeley at 13 stories. Turner Hall is home to more than 300 Bears who enjoy single bedrooms with shared living room and bathroom spaces. Between classes, Bears can take in scenic views from any of the 13 lounges or play pool with friends in the game room.

## RIDGE NEIGHBORHOOD

**NORTH HALL** — With plenty of cozy nooks and social spaces, North Hall is home to about 370 Bears and offers endless opportunities to build lasting connections. North Hall is located across from Campus Commons and is only a short bike-ride or walk to many destinations on West Campus.

**SOUTH HALL** — Spacious suites with unique social spaces are the draw for the 340+ Bears living in South Hall. Located near the Butler Hancock Athletic Center and Gear Shop, South Hall offers students convenient access to dining options, classrooms and study spaces.

**LAWRENSON HALL** — The tallest building in Greeley hosts a relaxed community of 430+ Bears. Suite-style rooms make Lawrenson Hall a perfect option for international students and is home to a pet-friendly community. Many of these apartment-style rooms include a private kitchen.

## MESA NEIGHBORHOOD

The Mesa Neighborhood is a vibrant area located within walking distance of the newly renovated Tobey-Kendel Dining, the Student Health and Counseling Centers, Snyder Green and the University Center. The Mesa Neighborhood showcases some of UNC's stunning historic buildings updated with modern amenities and features various community areas where students can play, study, perform at the Garden Theatre or relax on Gunter Green, or lounge on the new terrace and hammock grove at the University Center.

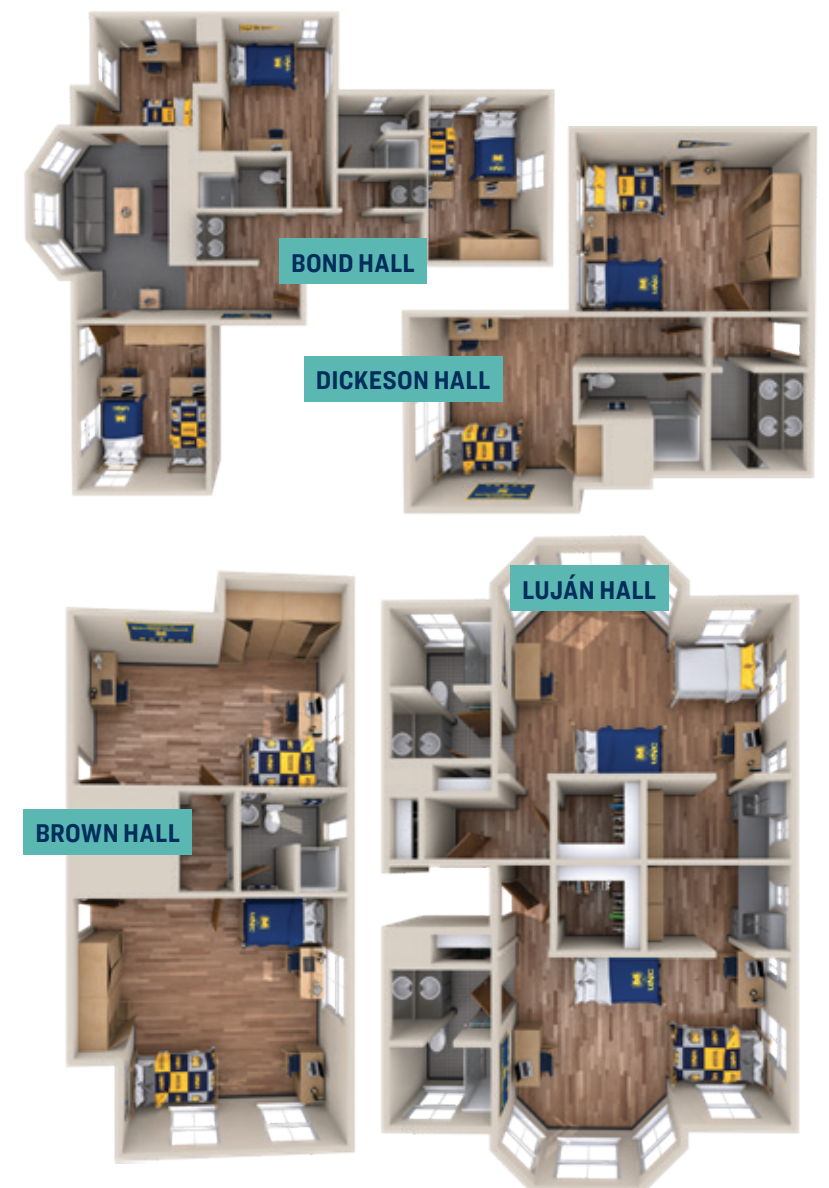

### BOND, BROWN, DICKESON AND LUJÁN HALLS

— These halls offer suite-style rooms and two- to six-person suites with bathrooms, kitchens and lounges. UNC's "Presidents Row" buildings artfully blend historic English Tudor-style architecture with state-of-the-art amenities.

**WIEBKING AND WILSON HALLS** — Double rooms in a large hall environment. Each hall offers easy access to the Asian Pacific American and Native American Student Services House, and the Marcus Garvey Cultural Center, with the César Chávez Cultural Center and Michener Library a few blocks away. Students share bathrooms, kitchens, lounges, game rooms, TV rooms and study rooms.

UNC also offers stand-alone homes situated near campus. Each house features single and double rooms, along with a kitchen, shared living room and shared bathroom.

Upperclassmen in select campus housing and students living off campus have access to smaller, flexible meal plan options, supporting their on-campus dining needs throughout the day.

Renovated and redesigned, Tobey-Kendel Dining (TK) features a food court-style setup, offering rotating menus and a range of cuisines and dining experiences. TK offers a wide variety of options from international flavors to classic comfort foods. Students can use their meal swipes at any station to enjoy a full meal — TK houses a 24/7 grab-and-go market and a Just Baked vending machine (hot food vending machine), making food available for students at all hours of the day!

UNIVERSITY CENTER FOOD COURT

Grab a bagel at Einstein Bros® Bagels, a sandwich at Subway®, or something quick at our convenience store, Munchy Mart.

Students can use their Meal Exchange option up to five times per week at select retail locations, making it easy and convenient to enjoy dining on campus while using meal plan swipes.



MORE DELICIOUS OPTIONS

GRAB-AND-GO MARKET

For those late-night study sessions or busy days when you need a quick meal, Tobey-Kendel Dining features a grab-and-go market with self-checkout stations. Students can access fresh and convenient meal options any time of the day or night with a simple swipe of their UNC Bear ID card.

BEAR ON THE RUN BOXES

University life can be busy, which is why we have Bear On The Run boxes (BOTR) to help students enjoy meals on the go. A fee of \$5 per semester grants you access. Once you're finished with your meal, wipe it out and exchange it for a new one at Holmes Dining Hall or Tobey-Kendel Dining. Accessible, sustainable and tasty.

VENDING MACHINES, CONCESSIONS AND COFFEE SHOPS

Starbucks® (located inside Holmes Dining Hall) and Bears Coffee Shop (located inside Michener Library) are both perfect for grabbing a latte to keep you energized throughout the day. Campus vending machines, available throughout campus, provide 24/7 access to snacks and beverages. TK's Just Baked machine and 24/7 market provide meals near residence halls. And on game days, enjoy a variety of delicious concessions foods to keep your energy up while you cheer on the Bears.



MOBILE ORDERING

UNC students can pre-order meals from Grubhub, and get discounts when they place a pick-up order at the University Center food court. Students can also use the Everyday app to view detailed menus and information for Holmes Dining Hall.
