

### COMPLETE YOUR APPLICATION

### FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS

Apply as a first-year student if you are a current high school senior, or, if you have previously completed high school and not enrolled in college-level coursework post-graduation.

### **Required Materials:**

- Submit Bear Application or Common Application
- High School Transcript(s)
- Valid Fee Waiver Code or \$50 Application Fee.

### TRANSFER STUDENTS

You are a transfer student if you have enrolled in at least one semester of college or university coursework post-high school graduation or completion.

#### **Required Materials:**

- · Submit Bear Application
- Valid Fee Waiver Code or \$50 Application Fee
- Official Transcript(s) from all Colleges/Universities
- Proof of High School Graduation

### **ADDITIONAL MATERIALS**

- All applicants will be invited to submit a personal statement and/or letter(s) of recommendation when applying.
   Supplemental materials are optional unless otherwise requested.
- International students without prior education in the United States will be required to meet requirements for demonstrated English proficiency or enroll in UNC's Intensive English Program.
- Students request access or are qualified based upon cumulative GPA will be invited to apply to the UNC Honors Program upon notification of general admission.


