KEEPING A COLLEGE EDUCATION WITHIN REACH

We are excited to announce UNC Tuition Promise for incoming undergraduate students starting in the fall of 2024. As a students first university, this initiative solidifies our commitment to lessen the financial burden for students with the greatest financial need, making a UNC education even more affordable and accessible.

For all students who meet the eligibility criteria, UNC Tuition Promise guarantees standard tuition and mandatory fees are covered up to 16 credits, or \$6,242 per semester, and will increase as tuition and fees increase throughout your time as an undergraduate student at UNC.

REQUIREMENTS

Full-time students who are pursuing their first bachelor's degree and meet UNC Tuition Promise program requirements will automatically qualify. Additional requirements include:

- Student must be a Colorado resident or eligible ASSET student
- Student must file Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Colorado Application for State Financial Aid (CASFA) by June 1
- Student must apply for and authorize College Opportunity Fund (COF)**
- Student must be enrolled in 12+ credits (the program covers up to 16 credits)
- Student must have Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP)***
- Household Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) at or below \$65,000 or a Student Aid Index (SAI) of 3,000 or less

^{*} There are a variety of fees for students, some of which are mandatory, including Student Activity, LEAF, Technology and Capital Fees, University policy is that students pay for these fees regardless of whether they choose to participate in or use those services available to them.

^{**} The College Opportunity Fund is a stipend created by the Colorado Legislature and signed into law in May 2004.

^{***} Students must be making satisfactory academic progress toward their academic degree program in order to maintain their eligibility for financial aid.
