

Open Admission (Spring 2027 start) Selection Process & Criteria:

Admission to the nursing program is different than admission to the University of Northern Colorado; there are two separate applications required.

Application to the University: www.unco.edu/admissions Use the code 'UNCnursing' to waive the application fee.

Application to the Nursing Program: <https://nursingcas.liaisoncas.org/apply/> Application goes live in NursingCAS on Wednesday, July 29th, 2026.

***It is highly recommended that ALL applicants to the UNC BSN programs first meet with a pre-nursing advisor to ensure you have all elements of your application complete. To meet with an advisor, you must be first admitted to UNC and have a bear number. You may still apply without completing this step, but please note that if you are missing any items your application will be rejected.*

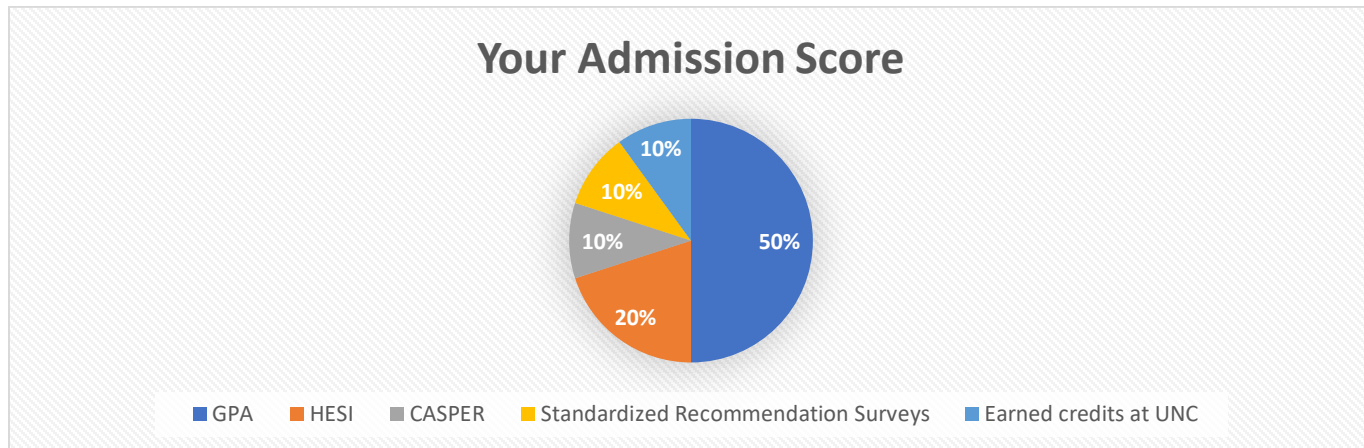
Completed applications must be submitted through NursingCAS on or before **Friday, September 18th, 2026, 5pm (MT)**

SCREENING CRITERIA:

- Completion of all application criteria. Please see the document "Open Admission Spring 2027 - Instructions for applying to the BSN program" for application instructions.
 - *If any item is missing, or if instructions are not followed correctly, the application will not be considered.*
- Submission of proof of registration in all remaining prerequisite courses. **No more than 4 of the 10 required prerequisite courses may be in progress at the time of application.** All courses must be predicted to finish by Friday, December 11th, 2026, or sooner (with a grade posted by Thursday, December 17th, 2026). An unofficial transcript may be submitted as proof of registration.
- Grade Point Average (GPA)
 - ALL official transcripts (including transcripts from UNC) must be submitted to [NursingCAS](https://nursingcas.liaisoncas.org/).
 - A minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale of most recent 45 credit hours, not including grades from technical courses, high school advanced placement courses, or remedial coursework.
 - A grade of 'C-/S+' or higher is required in each of the prerequisite courses (or course equivalent). S/U is not acceptable.
 - Course repeats/grade replacement – If you repeat a prerequisite course, the most recent grade from the first two completed attempts will be used for GPA calculation (must have a C- or higher). If you are repeating a course which is in progress during application, the previous completed grade will be used for calculation.
- Demonstration of English Proficiency (if applicable).
 - If your primary language is not English, if you are an International Student, or if you did not earn a high school or college level degree in the United States you will need to demonstrate required English proficiency for the clinical nursing program. Please contact the UNC Office of Global Engagement at global@unco.edu to assist with this process. English proficiency can be demonstrated by one of the following criteria:
 - i. TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) – minimum of 80 on the internet-based test (iBT) with a minimum score of 26 on the spoken English section.
 - ii. IELTS (International English Language Testing System) – minimum of 6.5 total score with a minimum speaking sub score of 7.

SELECTION PROCESS:

There are many components that go into our admission criteria that help us see who you are. GPA and the HESI exam give us a glimpse of how you perform academically. The Casper assessment and the Standardized Recommendation Surveys tell of your ability to work with others, communication, flexibility, problem-solving skills, and other professional attributes you possess. The different admission criteria come together to create your “admission score”:



- Admission GPA
 - Admission GPA will be calculated using the most recent 45 credit hours of coursework and GPA from all completed nursing prerequisite courses.
 - Courses/scores/grades not included in Admission GPA:
 - High School Advanced Placement (AP) scores.
 - Grades from technical courses such as CNA, EMT, etc.
 - Nursing courses from a technical school.
 - Grades from remedial coursework.
 - If you are taking prerequisite courses in Fall 2026, these courses will not be factored into the Admission GPA. *No more than 4 of the 10 prerequisite courses may be in progress during the Fall 2026 semester at the time of application.* All courses must be predicted to finish by Friday, December 11th, 2026, or sooner (with a grade posted by Thursday, December 17th, 2026).
 - Course repeats/grade replacement – students who have repeated a course will only have the most recent grade from the first two completed attempts used in Admission GPA calculation.
 - If you are repeating a prerequisite course during Fall 2026 semester, the previously completed, earned grade will be used in Admission GPA calculation.
 - If you are admitted to the Nursing program and earn less than a grade of ‘C-’/S+ in any of the remaining prerequisite courses or course equivalents during the Fall 2026 semester, your admission to the Nursing program will be rescinded.

Required prerequisite courses included in Admission GPA calculation (or transfer equivalent):

- **BIO 110-** Atoms to Cells
 - AP scores for Bio 100 and Bio 105 do NOT fulfill this prerequisite requirement

- **BIO 245** – Introduction to Human Anatomy and Physiology (must include minimum of 1 credit lab)
 - **BIO 246** – Advanced Human Anatomy and Physiology (must include minimum of 1 credit lab)
 - **BIO 251** – Allied Health Microbiology (must be a 4-credit course, must include minimum of 1 credit lab)
 - BIO 351 will also be accepted for this prerequisite requirement
 - **CHEM 281 and CHEM 281L** – Fundamentals of Biochemistry and Biochemistry Lab
 - **ENG 123** – College Research Paper
 - **FND 250** – Principles of Nutrition
 - **NURS 326** – Pathophysiology
 - **PSY 230** – Human Growth and Development
 - **STAT 150** – Introduction to Statistical Analysis
- Standardized Recommendation Surveys (SRS)
 - The SRS score will be averaged between 2 recommendations, one academic and one professional.
 - Casper Assessment
 - Casper uses a unique, open, video and text response format, leading to more authentic, in-the-moment responses. You can justify your reasoning, express your values, and share your individual perspectives and experiences.
 - Casper is a soft-skill assessment. Casper measures 10 competencies: collaboration, communication, empathy, equity, ethics, self-awareness, resilience, professionalism, problem solving and motivation.
 - Each test is rated by multiple independent raters, with a different rater for each scenario. The final score is an average of all raters' unique impressions, reflecting diverse perspectives on the applicant's performance. This reduces bias.
 - HESI Admission Assessment Exam
 - The HESI score is generated by averaging the scores from the 4 test categories (required subcategories- Reading Comprehension, Vocabulary and General Knowledge, Basic Math Skills, Anatomy and Physiology). There is no minimum total or subcategory score. You may only submit one HESI score/transcript each calendar year. You may submit HESI scores that are more than a year old. Detailed instructions on how to register for the HESI exam will be available on the [School of Nursing website](#).
 - UNC Earned Credits
 - The number of credits completed at UNC will be assigned points by the ULT and used in the overall admission score as outlined below.
 - 0-2 = 0 points
 - 3-5 = 1 point
 - 6-8 = 2 points
 - 9-11 = 3 points
 - 12-14 = 4 points
 - 15-17 = 5 points
 - 18-20 = 6 points
 - 21-23 = 7 points
 - 24-26 = 8 points
 - 27-29 = 9 points
 - 30 or more = 10 points

The weighting for the above admission criteria is as follows: 50% Admission GPA; 20% HESI exam score; 10% Standardized Letters of Recommendation; 10% CASPER; 10% earned credits at UNC. An overall admission score will then be assigned to each applicant, and all the applicants will be ranked based on their score.

Application requirement exemptions must be received before Friday, September 11th, 2026, at 5pm (MT) by BSN program coordinator Courtney Gryskiewicz at courtney.gryskiewicz@unco.edu prior to application submission. The exemption must outline what screening/admission criteria you are requesting the exemption for and your specific circumstance. The exemption will then be reviewed and a letter approving or denying your request will be sent back to you at your Bear Email address. Exemptions requested after the above due date will not be reviewed for this application cycle. Exemptions for minimum GPA will not be considered.

NOTIFICATION: notification letters will be sent to applicants by Thursday, October 22nd, 2026, to your Bear Email address.

If admitted into the Nursing Program:

Requirements and information for new nursing students: information about future requirements such as purchase of malpractice insurance, specific health clearance requirements, CPR certification, purchase of uniforms and ATI materials, and course information will be sent to admitted students once they have indicated they plan to attend the UNC Nursing program.

- A mandatory meeting for all newly admitted nursing students will provide essential program information. You must attend.
 - Mandatory meeting: Wednesday, November 4th, 2026 (12-1:30pm – Zoom). Link will be provided in your admission letter (if you are admitted).
- Please note: Admission to the program will be contingent on passing a background check (see disqualifying events on our website), clear drug screening, and completion of any outstanding prerequisite courses with a passing grade (C- or higher).
