Program Costs

The cost of attending UNC varies depending on residency status. The Ph.D. program is a member of Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE). If you are a legal resident of one of the Western states (AK, AZ, CA, CO, HI, ID, MT, NV, NM, ND, OR, SD, UT, WA, or WY), you may qualify for in-state tuition. Applicants who reside in other states may obtain Colorado residency after one year. Note: The rates below do not include tuition for required summer terms.

Internships

Historically, the majority of our doctoral students have traditionally pursued school-based internships, which are typically paid with a small stipend. In the past several years, the percentage of students pursuing APA-accredited internships has increased. Beginning with the doctoral cohort admitted in Fall 2016, students were required to pursue APPIC member internships. That cohort of students completed internship in 2020-2021.
