

Campus Connections Fall 2024 Mentor Coach Application Packet

Thank you for your interest in Campus Connections!

Campus Connections is a service-learning course that pairs youth referred from the local community with UNC students in a one-on-one mentoring relationship. Undergraduate and graduate students from all majors and disciplines are invited to apply. As part of the Campus Connections course, orientation and training for students is provided and covers topics including mentoring practices and stages of adolescent development, and students have the opportunity to implement wellness programming for the youth through fun and engaging activities.

As part of the course, **mentor coaches** are required to spend one evening per week as a leader and support for their mentor families, student mentors paired with youth mentees who have been referred to Campus Connections by the juvenile justice system, local schools, or other community organizations. The goal of this program is to reduce juvenile delinquency, increase academic performance and access to college, encourage pro-social and healthy behaviors for the youth, and facilitate an enriched learning experience for UNC students.

Community youth participants are 11-18 years old and are considered to be at risk of not reaching their full potential due to individual or environmental factors. Some Campus Connections youth have committed minor criminal offenses (Level 1, such as drug/alcohol possession or vandalism), and others are coping with difficult economic, family, social behavior, or other concerns.

Mentoring will take place once a week and will include individual tutoring, group meals, exercise and wellness, and positive enrichment activities, which will be student planned and implemented based on youth needs and interests. **Mentors and mentor coaches will participate in Campus Connections from 3:30 - 9:00pm. Youth will attend from 4:30-8:30pm.** Mentors and mentor coaches will have pre-lab (3:30-4:30pm) and post-lab (8:30-9:00pm) meetings to plan for and reflect on the mentoring experience, discuss weekly readings, and for other assignments related to mentoring facilitated through Blackboard.

During the Fall 2024 semester, Campus Connections will be offered **Thursday** nights and will be from 3:30pm-9:00pm. **Undergraduate students register for APCE 385 and graduate students for APCE 785.**

Mentor Coach Roles and Responsibilities

Mentor Coaches

- Are required to attend scheduled weekly lab sessions (3:30-4:30pm and 8:30-9:00pm).
- Must have completed at least one semester of Campus Connections as a mentor.
- Support youth mentees in assigned Mentor Family
- · Facilitate small group discussions during pre-lab sessions with mentors and offer support
- Provide youth and family updates through journals on Canvas
- Support mentors in applying evidence-based practices discussed in training
- Help mentors strategize and troubleshoot difficult situations
- Assist Campus Connections Instructors with nightly organization and coordination
- Lead groups during Walk-and-Talks
- · Monitor noise-levels and ensure building policies are followed
- Assist with family dinner
- Lead and assist families in nightly cleaning responsibilities
- Have fun with both the mentors and youth mentees
- Communicate with the Campus Connections Instructors and the other members of the Campus Connections Leadership Team
