The cost of attending UNCO varies depending upon residency status and the number of credits taken in a semester. The above tuition cost for full-time students is based on 12 credit hours each semester and 6 credit hours per summer (i.e., 30 credits total). The "university/institution fees or costs" listed include student fees based on 30 credits take each year.

The Counseling Psychology Program is a member of the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education's (WICHE) Western Regional Graduate Program. What membership in the WRGP means is that applicants who are residents of 15 western states (Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming) can qualify for resident tuition status starting their first year in the program. Applicants who are US citizens, but residents from other states would need to pay nonresident tuition their first year on campus but could then qualify for resident tuition status after one year in Colorado. International students currently remain classified as nonresidents throughout their degree program. Students are eligible for federal loans, scholarships and grants. In the past 10 years all incoming students, second year students, and the majority of other returning students were offered assistantships through the program which paid for a portion of the student's tuition and gave a stipend (contingent on performance). Some students obtained assistantships across the campus (e.g., Career Services, Disability Support Services, University 101, Cultural Centers, School of Psychological Sciences).
