The program awards a certificate or an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in Interpreter Preparation. The program follows the educational standards of the Conference of Interpreter Trainers. The Maryland Quality Assurance Screening (MQAS) Project is sponsored by the Maryland State Department of Education, Division of Special Education/Early Intervention Services (MSDE, DSE/EIS). Conferences and workshops are sponsored by the MQAS project, and are open to sign language interpreters who work with children in Pre-K, and kindergarten through grade twelve (12) throughout the State of Maryland. Workshops offered include training in theory and practice, as well as sessions to prepare interpreters to take the Educational Interpreter Performance Assessment (EIPA), both the written and performance based tests. Trainings are offered during the fall and spring, at no cost.
