Generalist Non-Degree Licensure Requirements for Modified Practicum

Teacher candidates who have enrolled in the Generalist Non-Degree Licensure program must complete courses specific to their needs and based on their prior

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degree(s) and state licensure(s). A course common to all teacher candidates is the practicum course (EDSE 693). All Non-Degree Licensure Program teacher candidates must enroll in EDSE 693 for 3 semester hours.

RFor teacher candidates who already possess initial teacher licensure, the modified practicum requires two components:

- 1. Completion of the requirements for program observation. This consists of six observations in a self-selected array of programs, age levels, and student populations. Teacher Candidates of EDSE 693 must observe six different sites, write up their observations, and record their visits on the Practicum Experience Matrix (included in this application packet). Each observation is expected to take ½ day and the reflection for each should be three pages.
- 2. Complete a 5-7 page reflection that outlines the roles and responsibilities of a Generalist educator and the information that has been gleaned through the program to support this substantiation.

Teacher candidates are expected to attend the on campus Practicum Seminars and to access the materials on the Blackboard webpage as opportunities to dialogue with other teacher candidates.

All materials are due into the Special Education Office by Monday of finals week. Please send completed requirements to UNC - School of Special Education, Attn: Eileen Balcerak, Field Experience Coordinator, Campus Box 141, Greeley, CO 80639.

(*Note: If a teacher candidate is accepted for non-degree licensure, but does not have initial licensure, that teacher candidate will be required to complete a full practicum.)

Part Three:

What scientifically-based knowledge guides your professional practice? How does this relate to curriculum and methods selection and implementation?

Part Four:

How will you incorporate the principles of Response to Intervention (RtI) to guide your assessment practices, evaluation of student progress, and implementation of the IEP and teaching in a standards-based system?
