Jailyn Jenkins is teaching Science Content Methods at CUE, and there's a possibility that she may teach more classes in the future. In the Phoenix and Denver metro areas, Jenkins has taught elementary STEM, middle school science, and high school chemistry and biology. She has been a teacher, an instructional coach, and a district facilitator. In her current role, she works under two departments, where she coaches and supports pre-service teachers who are pursuing alternative licensure.

Outside of teaching, Jenkins has worked at the city level in the Phoenix and Denver metro areas, primarily overseeing programming and supporting the holistic development of youth from pre-K to high school. She also has two businesses, one that provides technological support—from website development to technology tutoring and setup—and one where she provides coaching and consulting in the educational space.

When asked how she became connected to the Center, Jenkins said, "I met Rosanne Fulton

[Director of the Center for Urban Education] several years ago and have had several friends and colleagues attend classes at CUE. Their experiences were collectively positive, so when this opportunity presented itself, it seemed like a perfect alignment."

Jenkins enjoys the community at the Center and says the students are "amazing." She is looking forward to continuously connecting with them and sparking a love of and appreciation for science.
