
What I'm Looking Forward to I have been a paraprofessional for six years and am


very much ready to step into that lead role in the

What I'm Looking Forward to




Work with children and network with current teachers to gain insight into the field. It's also important to be patient, flexible, and passionate about helping students learn and grow. It's a


