Campus Culture Corner

Representatives of the UNC governance groups, including the Classified Staff Council Chair, are playing a vital role in the entire process of the Presidential Search Committee. In this national search, the committee conducted first-round interviews with candidates the week of March 5 and will again meet with candidates the first week of April for second interviews.

The Search Committee agreed that its representatives from the campus governance groups will continue to be integrally involved in the selection process until the new president is named. The committee, which consists of both the Board of Trustees and governance group representatives, is very confident that it will reach consensus on a sole finalist for the position. However, if for some reason this is not possible, the Board will fulfill its obligation to make the final decision with a great deal of input from the governance groups.

The plan is to announce the finalist in early April and, shortly thereafter, invite that individual to UNC to meet with the campus community. State law requires a waiting period of 14 days after announcing a finalist before making the hire. Therefore, if all goes as planned, UNC's new president should be hired by approximately mid-April.



The Bear Pantry lives on the lower level of Michener Library (L-15). Some of you may know we are incurring a temporary financial setback which has resulted in the Pantry being bare. It is sad to see a bare Bear Pantry! It is even more difficult to see students who rely on the pantry walk out without groceries.

<u>Calling all UNC BEARS!</u> The Bear Pantry has seen a 238% increase in individual visits since its "official" opening in Fall 2016, which has impacted our ability to keep our shelves stocked. Please consider donating and supporting the 829 students who have used the Bear Pantry since Fall 2016.

a refrigerator, freezer and shelves. This allows us to receive donations of fresh, canned, packaged, or frozen foods.
