Free COVID-19 On-Campus Kiosk Opens: The state of Colorado has launched a new COVID-19 testing kiosk at UNC's Nottingham Field. The kiosk is open from 9 a.m.-6 p.m., Monday through Saturday.

Update as of 11/12/20 from President Feinstein:

- Beginning Monday, November 16, the university will officially begin to follow the state's Safer at Home Orange guidance.
- Campus and Residence Halls Will Remain Open We recognize that many of our students rely on their on-campus housing as their primary residence and also know that many more prefer to remain on campus in order to access support and services through the end of the semester. Knowing this, UNC welcomes students to return to on-campus housing for the remainder of the academic year following Thanksgiving break. Dining will also remain open. Additionally, if you require winter break housing, please contact the Housing Office to arrange your plans by calling 970-351-2721.
- Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory Grading: Faculty Senate has voted to offer students the option to choose Satisfactory/Unsatisfactory grading for their Fall 2020 courses, with some limited exceptions. Students should check with their academic advisors to determine how S/U grading may affect them and whether it is the right decision for them at this time. The deadline for students to opt into S/U grading is December 23, 2020.
