## CHECKING TO SEE IF CONTENT HAS CAPTIONS-DVDS

- 1. For DVDs, flip to the back cover of the DVD. In many cases, DVDs with closed captions will have the **CC** logo on the back.
- 2. If the logo is not there, try inserting the DVD and trying one of the following options:
  - a. Lyrics, Captions and Subtitles
    - i. Right click anywhere in the screen
    - ii. Choose: Lyrics, Captions and Subtitles
    - iii. Choose: English
  - b. Special Features
    - i. As soon as Windows Media Player opens, right click on the DVD button on the lower left of the screen
    - ii. In the menu that appears, choose: Special Features
    - iii. Choose: Captions, and then English

## CHECKING TO SEE IF CONTENT HAS CAPTIONS

- 1. Open the file in Windows Media Player
  - a. Turn Captions On if Available
    - i. Right click anywhere in the screen
    - ii. Choose: Lyrics, Captions and Subtitles
    - iii. Choose: On if Available

## **STEPS FOR WATCHING WITH CAPTIONS**

- 1. Insert DVD, menu will appear providing option to open in Windows Media Player
- 2. DVD title menu will appear, select the **VIEW WITH SUBTITLES** option
- 3. At the bottom left of the screen it will say **DVD** with a little arrow for a drop down menu, **Click the Arrow**
- 4. From drop down menu, choose Special Features and then Captions
- 5. Choose **English**
