<u>Board of Trustees</u> (Vaughan) – There will be a BOT meeting on November 11 <u>President</u> (Feinstein) –

- The President has a busy schedule this week.
 - o Faculty and Staff of Color reception
 - o Colorado's Next Hispanic Serving Institution event with Dr. Roberto Montoya
 - Speaking at City Council
 - o Presenting at the downtown Rotary
 - o CFO second finalist
 - Weld County candidate forum

- Governor funding is due by November 1
- Insurance premiums are through the roof. The currently split is 60/40. Feinstein wanted to announce a salary increase in January, yet more expenses keep coming from the state. The University will need to absorb \$350,000.
- Family medical leave act: Funds now need to be populated (well over one million dollars) to pay for leaves, which is unlike the previous method. There will now be a 50/50 split of .9%. This is an unfunded mandate by the state.

- O Sileo asked if a faculty member must pay in if they do not subscribe to the university's insurance. She also asked if the University could lose money if it is not used.
- Feinstein said that HR would educate the faculty and staff on how it currently works and how it is going to work.

Provost (Fleming) -

- The Provost is working on program reviews and had three recommendations:
 - o a standard based self-study that three programs have agreed to pilot;
 - o dashboards that show program health progress; and
 - o another level of review like HSS currently conducts.
- The Provost and President will be attending three college forums this week.
- Innovation and Revitalization proposals were due Saturday. Forty-five were submitted.

Unfinished Business

- Faculty Senate bylaws
 - Feinstein asked about the meaning of Article III (K). Schuttler will contact Luger for clarification.
 - Levin proposed an order of selection for which committees could committee
 chairs serve on. A discussion followed concerning how representatives for
 committees are chosen. Levin's new language was discussed and tweaked,
 which will go to COD this week for review.
 - Haddad asked about Article VI (I)(d)(3) as he thinks it is too restrictive. A discussion followed on the current language. Kyle will ask SEC to consider adding "exceptions apply."
