- 4. Chair's Report (Kyle) This semester the newsletter was sent out in January and the next newsletter will be sent out at the end of the semester. The All-Faculty meeting will be on Thursday, April 17th at 3:00pm. This year's university-wide awards will be recognized at the meeting. The College of Osteopathic Medicine will begin hiring faculty, the Executive committee discussed how to incorporate them into senate. It was decided that we will begin by offering the opportunity to sit in at a Senate meeting next year and formally invite them as members the following year. The Shared Governance Reception is on April 8th at the Feinstein Residence, a different procedure is being used for invitations so please check your emails and register accordingly. Kyle and Senbet will be meeting with Hanover and possibly inviting them to a future Senate meeting. The Faculty Senate Scholarship liaison position is will be open next year for anyone interested.

5. Administrative Reports

President (Feinstein) – President Feinstein is looking forward to staff and student groups attending the Shared Governance Reception. A new Vice President of Student Affairs has been hired, Keith Humphery will be coming from Cal Poly starting mid-May. There is still some uncertainty at the federal level, but they continually monitor for any updates. The Bernie Sanders and Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez event this past Friday had a very large attendance and was very well run. President Feinstein is very proud of the team that put the event on in such a short period of time. Figure setting is set to take place next week. He acknowledged Barb Kirkmyer for being a great advocate for Higher Education and her support during this time.

Provost (Fleming) – They expected about 2000 people to attend the Bernie Sanders and AOC event but about 11,000 people were in attendance. Personnel files are being reviewed at the provost level in addition to reviewing the budget. HSI portal application is open, and Jennifer Almquist is leading that. The Dean of MCB and Vice provost search is progressing.
