#### Nomination for Organizational Design Task Force

• Luger advised that Michelle Quinn nominated Cieminski to represent the faculty on the Organizational Design Task Force. The task force will begin their work this summer.

*MOTION*: Luger asked for a vote to approve Cieminski's nomination to represent the faculty on the Organizational Design Task Force.

*VOTE*: The motion was unanimously by a voice vote.

#### **Special Reports**

#### **Unfinished Business**

<u>Reconsideration of the Proposed Revisions to the Liberal Arts Core</u> (Tabled at the April 29, 2019 Faculty Senate meeting).

- Luger thanked Levin for editing the Liberal Arts Curriculum Checklist for the Faculty Senate's review.
- Levin read through the edited sections of the Checklist pointing out the following:
  - Multicultural and International studies listed first in order to get to 31 credits, have to count twice.
  - Does not prohibit someone ending with 37 credits, but tries to get students to 31 credits.
  - The checklist does not reflect all the courses that will be in the Liberal Arts Core but gives a visual of what the checklist should look like.
  - The checklist should make it easier for the students to follow.

- There will be some courses dropped as well as added to the Checklist. There was some concern about how that will be done.
- What the faculty will vote on in the fall will go into effect in the fall of 2021.

MOTION: DeKrey moved to accept the Proposed Revisions to the Liberal Arts Core as presented.

SECOND: Senbet.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT: Clinefelter moved to add the following statement to the Liberal Arts Curriculum Checklist at the end of the U.S. Multicultural and International Studies Requirements paragraph (in two places): "In order to complete the Liberal Arts Core within 31 credits, six total credits must be doubled counted." DeKrey accepted the friendly amendment.

DISCUSSION:

• Clarification of the language used for transfer students.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT: Dawit moved to add the LAC categories to the multicultural and international courses. DeKrey accepted the friendly amendment.

DISCUSSION:

- Clarification of study abroad is needed.

- Trying to balance state compliance and streamline requirements.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT: Hernandez moved to list Multicultural and International Studies first in the title. SECOND: DeKrey.

FRIENDLY AMENDMENT WITHDRAWAL: Following clarification from Couch, Hernandez withdrew his friendly amendment.

*VOTE;* The motion to accept the Liberal Arts Core documents with the two clarifying amendments was unanimously approved by a voice vote.

- Luger reported there was a record number of faculty at commencement and thanked them for their participation.
- Merrill thanked Luger for carrying the MACE at the commencement.
- Merrill voiced a complaint RE: student view access to CANVAS after term has ended. Luger asked if those with the same concern would discuss with Couch after the meeting.
- Hernandez reminded the Senate that the Bear Pantry would be open during the summer and would appreciate donations.
