# **President's Office (Feinstein):**

- Dean searches are underway for Graduate School, University Libraries, and MCB. EBS Dean search will be underway soon.
  - o Charging meeting, finalize position description and post in about a week to 10 days
  - o Return to Senate when it is time to set up meetings for candidates
- There has been good turnout for Strategic Planning Forums from faculty, staff, and students
- Tammy Prusha is the new executive assistant for the Provost.
- Michelle Rettmer is the new budget analyst for Academic Affairs.

## **Board of Trustees (Fischer):**

- BOT meeting was held 9/6/19. There is a desire for longer meetings to learn more about university. Anderson and Rodriguez reported on SESS committee reports and microcredentials. Feinstein and Quinn gave financial reports; there was a surprise shortfall in room/board revenue. Emeritus faculty status granted for member who was missed in Spring 2019 (Grapes). The President's contract was revised, and his evaluation has a new systematic approach. BOT published a letter to the campus community about their approval of Feinstein's work thus far.
  - o Murry Do BOT members see themselves coming to campus more often?
  - o Fischer Yes, there is greater interest in more participation, including graduation.

There is no update regarding APC's Academic Appeal Procedure amendment proposals.

**Elections** (Senbet): We are postponing the deadline for the call for nominations until 9/17/19; more participation is needed. We will send out election later this week. Call for nominations - NHS has two vacancies on Faculty Senate.

**Faculty Welfare** (Luger): There is ongoing conversation about appointments and hiring. Focus is on contract renew/term conversion. Welfare will examine the procedure for requesting recusal in faculty evaluation. There is also discussion on the buyout incentive for early retirement.
