## 5. Administrative Reports:

## **President (Feinstein):**

- Greeley Day event at the State Capitol, 2/19
- Legislative session will end in May; Joint Budgetary Committee will likely make budget decisions in late April
- Working with CEOs, CFOs, and lobbyists to present a new formula for funding higher education, asking for 7%; the Governor has not agreed to anything more than 2.5% at this time

#### **Provost (Anderson):**

- Notification for Summer funding sent to Deans
- ASC feedback College Deans asked to convene with faculty leadership regarding faculty/student support services to fit the needs of each college. Would like to have a clear idea of how structures will look by Spring Break. Planning a campus forum for March 24.
- Overloads and course releases reflect on their value to units and how they impact budgets
- Enrollment numbers for Fall are starting to emerge, may be lower than anticipated based on deposits to date.

## QUESTIONS/DISCUSSION:

- Is it true that no individual personnel decisions have been made at this point?
  - Correct, no individual personnel decisions have been made at this time. More
    information regarding the reorganization process will be coming later this week.
- What is the target for savings and the estimated number of layoffs?
  - The target is to save \$5 million dollars; the number of positions to be eliminated is estimated at 65. Approximately 40 positions (about \$2 million) will be eliminated from Academic Affairs; roughly 22 positions (about \$1.5 million) will be from Student Affairs.
- What's going to happen with the work that will no longer be done/functions that are no longer performed?
  - The ASC model seeks to increase efficiencies for functions that must be accomplished. It must be determined at the unit level how to utilize fixed resources; some work will be sacrificed. In the case of Housing & Dining, there is less work to be done as these facilities are not at full use.

# 7. Standing Committee Reports:

**Academic Policies** (Toewe): Two items being considered: probation policy exemption proposal and changes to the exploring and seeking program catalog narrative. Two new items of business for Senate: Academic Appeals Procedure and Course Purge catalog policy.

**Codification** (Schuttler): If your committee is considering changes to its bylaws, please send to Codification.

**Elections** (Senbet): Call for nominations going out tomorrow; 8 vacancies on Senate. If you're eligible, please consider running again.

**Faculty Welfare** (Luger): Administrative Searches under new business; revisions to term conversion coming soon.

**Salary Equity** (Clinefelter): Considering distribution models for the 2% pool for faculty/staff raises. Faculty promotions will now be funded separately, which means the pool will go further.

VOTE: Approved by voice vote

- HR Director Marshall Parks and University Counsel Dan Satriana are in attendance to aid in discussion and provide context for the Loan Policy.
- o New policy would limit borrowers to one loan from their 401a at any given time.
  - Currently, there is no limit on loans taken from 401a accounts.
    - Limiting loans would reduce the burden on HR to manage them.
  - 401a is the replacement for Social Security; no one may borrow from Social Security.
  - UNC is the only Colorado university allowing multiple loans; most schools in Colorado do not allow loans or only allow one loan.
  - Does not affect terms of current loans.
  - 10yr payback if used for primary home purchase; 5yr payback if used for other purposes.
  - The default rate for those who have multiple loans is about 50%.
- o The Loan Policy will not be part of the BPM or UR
- o If approved, the policy would go into effect July 1, 2020.

MOTION: It is moved to approve the Loan Policy as presented.

VOTE: Approved by voice vote.

#### 12. New Business:

# • Academic Appeals Procedure

- Primary changes outlined in the preface: visual chart, timely procedures, clarified language to close loopholes, define working/calendar days
- o From initiation of an appeal to resolution: 120 days

MOTION: It is moved to approve the changes to the Academic Appeals Procedure as presented. VOTE: Approved by voice vote.

## • Catalog language - Course Purge

- o Codifies in the catalog the practice already in use by the Registrar's Office at the direction of the Provost's Office.
- Every Spring semester, a report is generated that shows what courses have not been taught in the past 6 years.
  - The report does not include reserved-number courses.
  - Courses will be removed from the curriculum unless the unit specifies otherwise; departments are asked to provide written justification.

QUESTIONS/DISCUSSION: This practice helps ensure what is published in catalogs is being offered. It's not fair to students to advertise what is not actually offered (truth in advertising). There is a question as to what is 'sufficient justification' from departments to keep courses. Could Graduate courses be pulled every 10 years instead of 6 years? The 6-year cycle reflects how long catalogs are in effect; courses need to be available as long as there are students who are subject to the particular catalog. Courses may be reactivated through the curriculum workflow.

 Table the issue to allow time to check for HLC requirements, address what is adequate justification, adjust the reference to Chair/Director, and add school to reference about departments.

MOTION: It is moved to table the issue of the Course Purge policy.

VOTE: Approved by voice vote.

#### • Administrative Position Searches

- Codifies the practice used in the last couple years, incorporating faculty participation in searches and to chair searches.
- o Processes laid out for Academic Affairs searches at various levels (university-wide and college-level) as well as Non-Academic Affairs searches.

MOTION: It is moved to approve the policy for Administrative Position Searches as presented. VOTE: Approved by voice vote; one opposed.
