## • GOAL Program – Proposal for participation in commencement

• No new development at this time. Although there is no hurry for Fall ceremony, it would be good to establish policy in the catalog for future ceremonies.

# • Campus-wide policy for academic misconduct

- With the current policy outlined in the Bear Code, faculty must report incidents of academic misconduct to the Dean of Students.
  - Faculty choose how to address the incident with the student; there is no mandated disciplinary procedure they must follow.
- The committee expressed support for the academic misconduct policy as written.

- Faculty don't want to miss opportunities to educate students about plagiarism/academic misconduct; a mandated punishment misses the mark, especially when dealing with first-time offenders.
- Gilis is welcome to submit a written proposal for policy change to APC.

# • Summer Enrollment Proposal from Athletics

- The Registrar contacted Northern Arizona University for information regarding their reduced credit amount for fulltime status in Summer.
  - The policy does not align with their having to report 12 credits as fulltime for the National Student Clearinghouse; essentially the policy and the process don't match.
- Per the Federal Student Aid Handbook, full-time status for undergraduates is at least 12 credits.

## • Question/discussion about policy submissions

- o The Registrar's Office is working with Student Affairs on policy updates surrounding name changes and preferred names.
  - Usually, the Registrar would bring anything catalog-related to APC, but this
    particular topic is not related to academics.
  - As the policy relates to students, perhaps the proposals should go to the UGC and GC for review instead of APC.
