### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:31pm.

## Approval of the Agenda

Approved with a change in the order of business to discuss the BOAC item first after Special Reports.

# Approval of the January 31, 2022 meeting minutes

Approved without objection.

Announcements/Chair's Report

## Reports from Councils:

Graduate Council (Brewer) – No Report.

Liberal Arts Council (Wood) – We are implementing indirect assessment and looking at the selection process for the Summer Bridge program LAC course offering.

Professional Education Council (Kraver) – The State legislature is considering HB22 1220: Removing Barriers to Educator Preparation; the bill addresses financial obstacles teacher candidates face.

Undergraduate Council (Dineen) – UGC also discussed the Summer Bridge program. There is ongoing discussion about the creation of a permanent S/U grading option; we may have something to share after UGC's March meeting.

Student Senate (Benavidez) – No Report.

#### **Special Reports**

### • NR Grading Usage Policy update (Registrar)

- o Couch presented as an information item a change to the grading policy of the Graduate catalog to remove the use of the "NR" grade; this update is required to become compliant with a change to Federal Student Aid policy.
- The use of "NR" does not reflect successful completion for respective course(s) and is not considered a passing grade/successful completion toward Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) per Federal Student Aid policy.
- o UNC is moving toward the use of "S" and "U" grading for courses that utilize "NR" grading practices.
- o As the Federal policy clarification was implemented July 1, 2021, we are applying the change this semester and updating "NR" grades from impacted 2021 semesters.

## **Unfinished Business**

- Permanent S/U Grading Policy on hold
- Posthumous Degrees

- o The committee reviewed the recommended changes from Codification.
- o The revised policy language must be mirrored in the relevant sections of the university catalog.

MOTION: Benedict – It is moved to accept Codification's recommendations as presented and bring the policy to Faculty Senate.

VOTE: Approved by voice vote.

### • Enrollment Status/Intensive English Program

- o Couch presented revised language that addresses both the undergraduate and graduate levels.
- o Members made the following recommendations:
  - List the specific federal regulation, instead of linking the citation.
  - Add a row/column in the enrollment status chart for IEP to provide a clear visual reference.
- o Couch will make further revisions and return the proposal to APC at a later meeting.

#### **New Business**

### • Missed Classes/University-Sponsored Activities (BOAC)

- Larson and Fischer presented an initial draft of a clarifying paragraph to add to the attendance policy in Board Policy to address students who miss class activities due to their participation in university-sponsored activities.
  - Placement: 2-3-402(1)(b)(I) for On-Campus Programs and 2-3-402(2)(b)(I) for Off-Campus Programs
- o The proposal arose from the Board of Athletic Control (BOAC) but would include any university-sponsored activities, not just athletics.

#### **DISCUSSION:**

- o Considerations:
  - Clarification beyond what is already listed as to what is considered a university-sponsored activity (e.g., field experiences, conferences)
  - Perhaps coaches/staff could provide notice of approved activities, as well as students providing notification
- o Members discussed what is considered reasonable accommodation.
  - For example, some faculty build into their classes a policy to drop the lowest graded *x*-number of assignments/tests. This is considered a reasonable accommodation if the policy is equitably applied to classes missed for any reason (e.g., sickness, activities).
- Levin noted that the catalog already has language concerning attendance, including a
  paragraph regarding students involved in university-sponsored activities; see

- As currently written, there is room for disagreement regarding attendance policies as listed in Board Policy and expectations listed in the catalog.
- o Perhaps Board Policy could be updated to be consistent with the catalog language or simply refer to the relevant policy in the catalog.
- o Perhaps 2-3-402 can be amended to include language to say that instructors are responsible for maintaining policies consistent with the catalog.

o Fischer will work with Levin to revise Board Policy language and work with the BOAC to review catalog language/propose any revisions as appropriate.

### • Senate bylaws, Article V – The Academic Policies Committee

- o The Codification committee is reviewing/revising Faculty Senate bylaws and asked each Senate committee to review their respective section.
  - Codification will be updating the language throughout the bylaws to use inclusive pronouns (e.g., changing "his/her" to "their").

#### **DISCUSSION:**

- o In section A., the chairs of UGC, GC, LAC, and PEC are denoted as members; it would be consistent with practice and provide flexibility to add "or their designee" to that section.
- o In section D., consider the following edits:
- D. The APC shall receive and review bi-weekly and annual reports and policy recommendations from the University's UGC, GC, LAC, and PEC. Recommendations on the approval of these reports and policy issues shall be prepared for consideration by the Senate.
  - o Consider whether to keep/revise section F:
- F. The APC chair or designee from the committee shall serve as a representative of the Senate on the advisory committees of the CAO.
  - o Currently, the Senate chair attends the Deans Council and the Academic Affairs Leadership Team as the Senate's representative.
  - o Also, the chairs of both APC and Faculty Welfare are currently serving on the Academic Covid Responsiveness Group.
  - o The committee will continue review at a later meeting.
