New Business

• Permanent S/U Grading Policy

• The committee discussed the prospect of creating a permanent S/U grading policy and reviewed policy considerations/examples from other institutions that Couch submitted to APC last Spring.

• Considerations include:

- Timing/deadline for S/U selection
 - where to establish the cut-off for S/U selection in a semester (e.g., by the drop deadline, by the withdrawal deadline, etc.)
- Conditions of eligibility for S/U selection
 - whether/how to limit the types of classes eligible for S/U selection (e.g., exclude major/minor, LAC, licensure, etc.)
 - whether/how to limit the total number of credits eligible
 - what sort of application process to put in place for S/U selection (e.g., requiring advisor consultation and/or approval to take a course as S/U)
- Differences at the UG and GR level

- suitable policy for the UG level may not be applicable at the GR level and vice versa
- S/U letter grade equivalency
 - what will be the minimum letter grade equivalent for earning "S"
 - "S+" was utilized in UNC's emergency S/U grading option to signify grades of "C-" or higher for the purposes of transfer within Colorado's gtPathways.
- Rationale for implementing S/U grading
 - exploration in areas outside of a student's program of study
 - as an option to relieve student stress/mental health issues
- Potential implications depending on policy parameters:
 - If a student takes a course as S/U to explore an area of study, then changes their major to that area of study, the course would not satisfy major requirements if major/minor courses are ineligible for S/U.
 - The level of faculty feedback/standard of grading may vary depending on whether a student is taking a course for a letter grade or S/U.
 - The timing of the deadline for S/U selection (drop deadline early in the term or withdrawal deadline later in the term) will impact faculty grading.
 - Setting an early semester deadline aligns more with the exploration rationale, while setting a later semester deadline aligns more with a relief rationale.
 - Some majors at UNC (including teacher licensure programs) have higher GPA requirements than 2.0; S/U selection would be inappropriate for courses required in such majors.
- Additional discussion:
 - A permanent S/U grading policy would fall under the broader grading policy of the University catalogs.
 - There are no negative financial aid or VA implications associated with having an S/U grading policy.
 - Some students who selected S/U grading during the pandemic later had to request the letter grade for those courses as part of the application process for other schools/programs.
- Vaughan asked the membership to take the issue back to their respective areas and ask their colleagues for input/feedback.
- MOTION: Pullen It is moved to charge UGC with creating a policy recommendation for the undergraduate level and to charge GC with creating a policy recommendation for the graduate level.

VOTE: Approved by voice vote.
