## **Proposed Constitutional Amendment - Inclusive Pronoun Usage**

**Originator/Date:** Originated from the Codification Committee and approved on <u>8/30/2021</u> by the <u>Faculty Senate</u>

**Placement:** University Catalog, University Regulations, and Board Policy Manual (including the Faculty Constitution)

**Purpose and Rationale:** To be inclusive and align with University values, this update allows for consistent and comprehensive changes to pronoun usage in University policies.

**Current Language:** he/him/his and she/her/hers

**Proposed Language:** they/them/theirs

## **Additional Information:**

- Each policy section will be reviewed individually to ensure the meaning is preserved and the context is clear when the wording is changed.
- Where gendered pronouns are used in direct quotes of State or Federal statute, the original pronoun usage must be retained.

## **Example text:**

- 2-3-105(9): "An officer of a faculty governance body shall be eligible to succeed <a href="https://herself.">https://herself.</a>"
- 2-3-105(11): "A member of a faculty governance body who will be absent from a majority of the meetings of that body during one semester, shall appoint an alternate from among the voting faculty in the entity <a href="he/she-the member">he/she-the member</a> represents, and shall inform the Faculty Senate of any such appointment prior to the first meeting attended by the alternate."
