Grants do not have to be repaid. Examples are the **Federal Pell Grant**, **Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant**, **Colorado Student Grant**, and the **UNC 1889 Founders Grant**. Some of the grants listed are restricted to Colorado residents.

Scholarships can be based on merit or talent, and they do not have to be repaid. There are many searchable scholarship databases online available to students, and keep in mind that none of these should cost money or ask for your social security number.

Need-Based Work-Study offers part-time employment to students who work on campus for university employers or off campus in certain community service positions. Work-study is available to eligible residents and nonresidents.

No-Need Work-Study has different eligibility requirements. To apply you must complete the FAFSA and not qualify for need-based financial assistance. This award is only for Colorado resident undergraduate students. First priority is given to students who meet the March 1 deadline for the FAFSA and who also received funding from this program the previous year.

Federal Subsidized Loans are need-based funds that must be repaid at a future date, usually beginning six months after you graduate or leave school.

Non-Need-Based Loans must be repaid as well. They may be available for up to the cost of attendance minus other aid and are offered to qualified parents. An example is the **Federal Direct Parent PLUS** loan, available to parents of dependent students.

The **Federal Direct Unsubsidized Stafford Loan** is available up to program maximums. Students may choose the option to pay the interest on the loan while in school or have the interest deferred until repayment. Deferring the interest will result in higher repayment amounts.



Scholarships Recognize Many Types of Talent–*Not Just GPAs*

Scholarships can be based on merit or talent. Scholarships are a form of financial aid that doesn't have to be paid back, which is a big help when trying to make college more affordable.

UNC SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

The UNC Scholarship Application is another simple way for students to apply for scholarships. Admitted students can complete the UNC Scholarship Application, which is really simple and takes minutes. Many of these scholarships are talent-based, and not just merit-based. All you need is to activate your Ursa account.

COLOARDO OPPORTUNITY FUND STIPEND

Colorado residents need to make it a top priority to apply for the College Opportunity Fund (COF) stipend. The fund was established by the Colorado legislature to reduce the cost of tuition for Colorado resident undergraduate students. If you do not apply for the stipend, then you will pay a higher tuition rate.

UNC GREELEY PROMISE SCHOLARSHIP


Greeley high school seniors who have graduated from any Greeley or District 6 high school are also eligible for the UNC Greeley Promise Scholarship. This \$2,000 per year (renewable up to four years with satisfactory academic progress) scholarship is automatically awarded when you apply and are admitted to UNC.

WELD COUNTY BRIGHT FUTURES

Weld County 2017 graduating high school seniors are eligible for the Weld County Bright Futures Grant. This is a renewable grant up to four years for those who qualify.







Adding It All Up

Creating a budget can help you manage your money and spending habits, as well as estimate how much money you will need to borrow. You do not have to take the maximum amount of loans awarded to you. Taking out a student loan does help you establish credit, however remember you'll need to pay them back with interest.

TO CREATE A BUDGET

- Track your spending and daily expenses for at least a month. This will help you develop a realistic budget based on honest spending habits.
- Make a list of your income and expenses. For your income, include what you will earn from your work-study/job, scholarships, and other financial aid. When you list out your expenses it is helpful to list them out in categories: from your spending, housing, food, travel, entertainment, and education expenses.
- Total your expenses and then total your income. Then determine how much you can spend on your needs for the whole semester. If your expenses are more than your income or if it looks like you may run out of money by the end of the semester, you will need to find areas to cut back your spending. It is not uncommon for students to reduce personal spending while attending college.
