

Campaign for UNC: Update

With the Campaign for UNC in full swing, momentum is building in support of student success and other university priorities thanks to the generous donors who made contributions during the 2016-2017 year.



Total Campaign dollars to date: \$30,216,291 from 7,262 donors

"While we are pleased to report strong progress, the story we're most excited to share is the one about opportunity made possible by UNC's most generous donors," said Vice President for Development & Alumni Relations Allie Steg Haskett '03. "UNC donors continue to demonstrate, through their philanthropy, an inspiring commitment to our students, faculty and programs."

UNC donors are increasing access and affordability by funding scholarships and supporting programmatic needs, helping to offset the cost of tuition and fees for students. By funding scholarships, they're also helping ensure Bears succeed through to graduation. In fact, scholarship recipients are 14% more likely to continue their studies uninterrupted through to graduation and in a shorter amount of time than students who do not receive scholarships.

Enrollment this fall grew to nearly 13,000 students—the highest number of Bears enrolled at UNC in over a decade. That's how many lives UNC donors will be changing this year and for many years to come with their generosity.

"UNC's future is bright, in large part because individuals continue to believe in and support this outstanding institution and our students," said Steg Haskett. "I'm proud to say with confidence, that there is no better time to be a Bear than today."

First UNC Honors Alum Gives Back to Future Educators

A gift from alumnus Paul Heidger '63, along with a matching grant from the Colorado Department of Higher Education, will provide \$113,000 for UNC's Honors Program.



First Honors Program Alumnus Paul Heidger '63

Heidger recently established the Barbara Heidger Opportunity Scholarship in honor of his late wife, Barbara (Hyslop) Heidger '63. The two met as honor students at UNC, then Colorado State College, when the program was first created in 1959.

"I sincerely hope this scholarship bearing Barbara's name, together with knowledge of her life story and accomplishments in education, in promotion of global awareness and peace, and in self-giving service to others may assist similarly inspired young women and men at UNC to reach their life goals and full potential," Paul said.

At Paul and Barbara's wedding, fellow Honors classmate, Bill Hayes, served as best man and classmate Sharon Wilson (now a UNC Professor Emerita) was one of Barbara's attendants. Dr. Eugene Koplitz, UNC professor and first Honors Program director, and Honors Professor Dr. Forrest Frease and their families were honored guests.

Dedication to their passions led Barbara and Paul to accomplished paths of service to their professions, their students, and, especially for Barbara, to members of the international community. Barbara's family, students, colleagues, and many friends from around the world were saddened by her premature death in 1994, at the height of her personal and professional life. She was a devoted wife and mother to her and Paul's daughters, Julie and Lisa.

Paul recently retired from the University of Iowa, where he was a professor of Anatomy and Cell Biology. He eventually remarried and currently enjoys an expanded family of their shared children and grandchildren.

THE UNC HONORS PROGRAM

Few data exist from the Honors Program's first years, but student numbers have grown from a small class in 1959 to over 200 participating students from multiple disciplines last year. The program's percentage of first-generation students surpasses that of UNC, with nearly 39% of current honors students being the first in their family to attend college.

"The generous gift from Paul and his family will provide support for years to come. These scholarships help UNC to recruit the best and the brightest into our Honors Program, which seeks to develop tomorrow's problem solvers," said UNC Director for Honors and Scholars Loree Crow. "Scholarship support of these motivated students is essential to building the strongest cohorts and is invaluable to the individual students who often need just a little extra to help them to succeed at their highest potential."

The Barbara Heidger Honors Opportunity Scholarship

Established by her family and friends to honor the memory of Barbara Jane (Hyslop) Heidger '63, this scholarship will provide financial assistance to outstanding first-year students at UNC in need and who have been accepted into the Honors Program.




Paul's total gift of \$60,000 to establish a scholarship endowment matched by the State of Colorado through a Colorado Department of Higher Education Grant, called the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative (COSI), will create a total impact of over \$113,000 to the Honors Program.



The Honors Program plans to use these funds to create scholarships for exceptional incoming freshmen. In honor of Barbara's passion for International Studies, preference will be given to students who have an interest in international relations and education. Heidger plans to establish an additional Honors Program scholarship for students interested in science.
