2. Enter your **Bear Number** and **Birth Date** and click on **Login**. If you don't know your Bear Number, click on "I Forgot my Bear Number?" in the left-hand navigation menu.



 Validate your identity by entering the last four digits of your Social Security Number (SSN) and click on Login. If your SSN isn't on file, you'll be asked to enter your last name.
